

25 July 2014: Italy – Costa Concordia



SITUATION

- The Italian cruise ship Costa Concordia struck a reef off the Tuscan island of Giglio (Italy) on 13 January 2012. The ship was carrying more than 4 200 people; 32 people died in the incident. The Italian Civil Protection Department is coordinating the activities from the beginning.
- More than two years after the crash, the wreck of the Costa Concordia has been re-floated, using 30 spousons fixed on both sides of the wreck to ensure proper buoyancy.
- The wreck left the Island of Giglio on 23 July, towed towards Genoa (north-western Italy).
- As of 25 July, there have been no signs of environmental pollution, along the track.
- The arrival of the Costa Concordia in Genoa Voltri port is expected early in the morning of 27 July.
