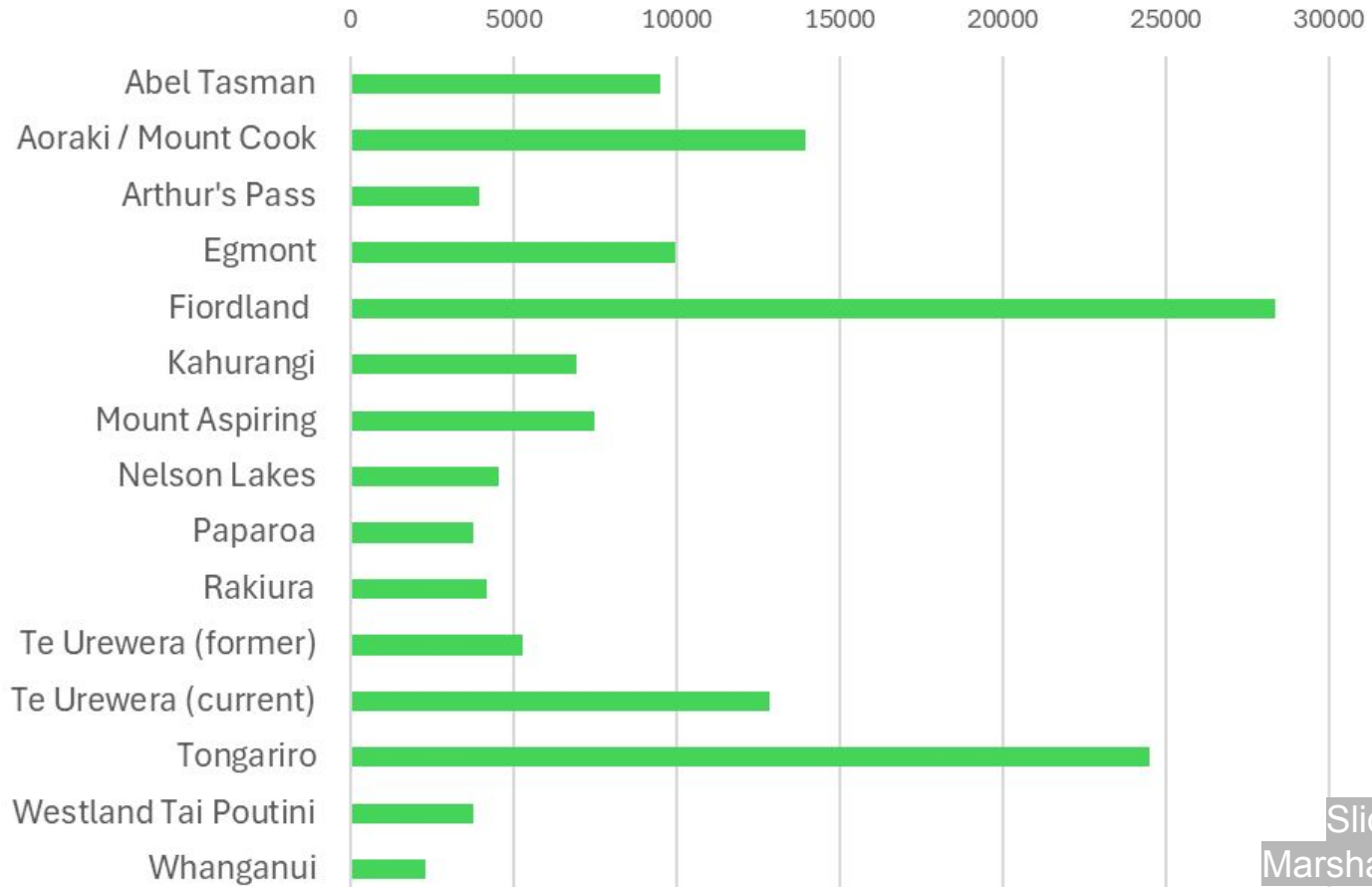
Improving coverage of New Zealand's National Parks

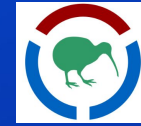
