LATE-FLOWERING TULIPS

ON page 5 of this book are offered an up-to-date list of late-flowering Tulips, including Darwins and Cottage Garden varieties. All of these are highly desirable for planting out doors for a supply of spring cut flowers, while many of the Darwin sorts are suitable for forcing. The florist who has store trade, or who delivers his flowers to the retailer who has a fancy trade, will make money from these. If forced, they require only a moderate heat; they should not be treated like early-flowering forcing tulips. The shades of color produced by the late-flowering tulips in many cases cannot be duplicated in any other class. The stems are 18 to 24 inches long, which makes them a valuable flower for cutting. Be sure and include some of them in your order.

SPECIAL NOTE

On account of restrictions placed on the use of fuel (coal) it will be profitable for every florist to plant a quantity of late tulips outdoors for spring cut flowers.

IMPORTANT NOTICE.

SHIPMENTS OF PERISHABLE GOODS can only be made at your risk.

When forwarded by Adams, Wells-Fargo, American or other railway express lines, and freight.

For twenty-eight years it has been our custom to guarantee the arrival in good order of perishable plants, roots, and cold storage bulbs. This custom for the present period or during the War we regretfully are obliged to change. While we will continue to supply and carefully pack such merchandise, we do not wish to hold ourselves responsible for the delays and negligence of transportation companies.

If shipments arrive in bad condition, accept them and receipt for them accordingly, and make claim for your loss on the transportation company. We, of course, will hold ourselves ready to assist you in any possible way. It has been found that claims can be collected more readily by the person receiving the goods than by the shipper.

Our custom to guarantee the actual arrival of goods, except at points where there is no freight or express agent, will still be continued, and claims for loss or non-arrival of merchandise not perishable will as in the past be cared for by us, so you run no risk of having to make claims for lost goods.

BUSINESS TERMS

We especially invite **Charge Accounts**. A charge account is more convenient than to remit for each order at the time it is sent us; you pay no more for your goods by reason of this accommodation. As to our responsibility, we refer you to **Dun's or Bradstreet's Mercantile Agency**.

When sending your first charge order, refer preferably to some one in either your own or our line of business with whom you have a charge account. This frequently saves delays.

NET CASH ITEMS

Grain, Clover, Bird and Farm Seeds, also Fertilizers, are handled on very close margins and are sold with no cash discount.

DISCOUNTS

On bills for Flower, Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs, a discount of 2% for payment 10 days from date of bill may be deducted, if cash accompanies the order 3% may be deducted on such items. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotation unless otherwise agreed upon.

TRANSPORTATION ADVANTAGES POSSESSED BY PHILADELPHIA

Freight—Philadelphia's transportation facilities are unsurpassed by any other city in the U. S. The Pennsylvania R. R., Philadelphia & Reading R. R., Lehigh Valley R. R., and the B. & O. R. R. all have terminals in Philadelphia.

Boat Connections—The Clyde Line S. S. Co. and the Merchants & Miners S. S. Co. sail direct from Philadelphia for points as far south as Jacksonville, and the connections they have with the Mallory Line serve other extreme southern points. The Merchants & Miners Line also sails direct from Philadelphia to Boston, from where it serves points in New England.

Express Service—Philadelphia is served by express service of the Adams, Wells-Fargo, and American Express Companies, operating at present as the American Railways Express Company, which reaches every part of the U. S.

PARCEL POST

This method provides a quick, reasonably safe and inexpensive transportation of such goods as will be accepted by Parcel Post, such as flower, vegetable, grass and field seeds and many sundries; liquid preparations cannot be mailed with safety. Packages are accepted up to 70 lbs. for the first, second and third zones; and up to 50 lbs. for the other zones.

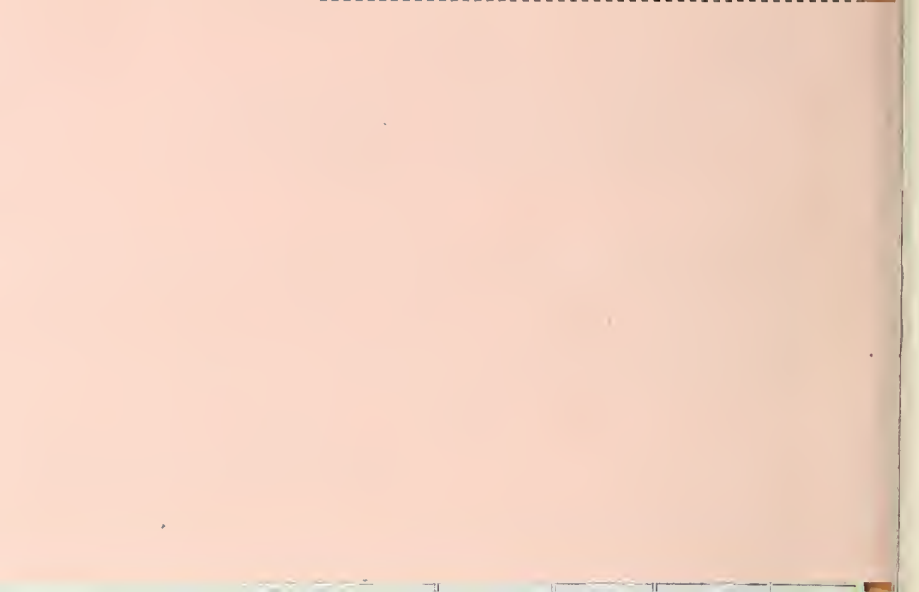
**Bird's Eye View

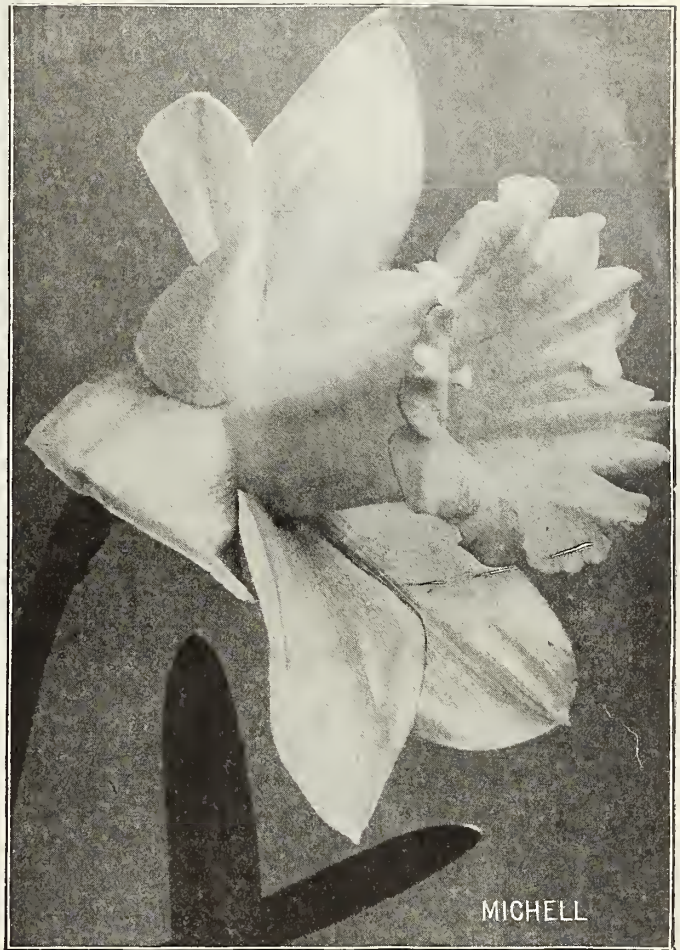

A collection of Paeonies constitutes a most valuable asset, steadily increasing in value from year to year. Paeonies as cut flowers, always demand a good price and yield a very profitable income from the investment. For home and table decorations they are exceedingly effective, and last in water longer than most other flowers. For social functions, weddings and church decorations there is nothing more suitable. Festiva Maxima and Officinalis types are usually ready in the latitude of Philadelphia by Decoration Day. The flowering period of others is carried through the month of June. Paeonies require, after planting, practically no attention except a top dressing of well-rotted manure in the late autumn.

CULTURAL NOTE ON PAEONIES

Autumn or during April is one of the best times for planting. The soil should be well enriched with well-rotted manure. The roots should be set about 3 feet apart in rows, the latter 4 feet apart, to enable them to be cultivated with horse machines. The crowns should not be set more than 4 inches below the top of the soil; deeper planting may mean fewer flowers, sometimes none. Cultivate them freely, prior to and after the flowering season.
