My dear Minister,

letter number 366/T3, of the 10th of August last, on the subject of the American prisoners of Tar and civilian internees from ake Island, the Government of the United States of America has asked me to notify the Imperial Government as follows:

Proximately 400 American civilians from Take Island. While United States Government welcomes offer Japanese Government to report on welfare of individuals upon request it expects Japanese Government to report all names promptly in accordance with Article 77 of the Geneva Prisoners of War Convention through International Red Cross Information Bureau or protecting power."

I must add that contrary to what His Excellency Mr. Togo thought in the aforementioned letter, I have not received any individual slips on American citizens captured at Take Island by the Japanese forces.

Begging Your Excellency to consent to furnish me the information asked for by the American Government I take this opportunity to renew to you the assurances of my highest regard, my dear Minister.
