1. The communications facilities and two-man radio team of FEC/LG are inadequate to handle the traffic load imposed on them, and with the added load of expanded CCRAK operations in Korea planned for 1953 and approved by CINCPAC, they will be inadequate to handle even priority traffic efficiently. (See Incl 1).

2. Past planning to handle the increased load has been predicated on construction of a new station at Camp Drake equipped with superior antennae and radio-teletype. Present indications are that although the Department of the Army will approve radio-teletype equipment for this installation, delivery will be delayed several months. In addition the present site at the NYK building is not adequate for a proper radio installation and cannot realize the full potentialities of even improved equipment. It is felt that the radio circuit will not be adequate until the organization is moved to Camp Drake.

3. The present traffic load includes priority traffic of an operational nature involving lengthy messages. This includes CCRAK spot reports which cannot be passed through normal communications channels, and the daily operational summary which must be cleared and decoded by 0730 every morning. In addition to these recurrent long messages and the routine operational traffic the current expansion program approved by FEC, FEAF, and COMNAVFE requires that messages to coordinate the program be handled expeditiously.

4. Due to the inadequacy of radio communications facilities much of this traffic must be handled by telephone. Telephone facilities are likewise overloaded, are an inaccurate and slow means of conveying coded information, and breaches of security are likely to occur. Spare teletype channels have informally been determined to be available, as well as the required equipment.

5. To relieve this situation it is requested that a teletype channel between Tokyo and Seoul be made available to the Far East Command Liaison Group and the necessary teletype equipment be installed at both ends to handle FEC/LG - CCRAK traffic.

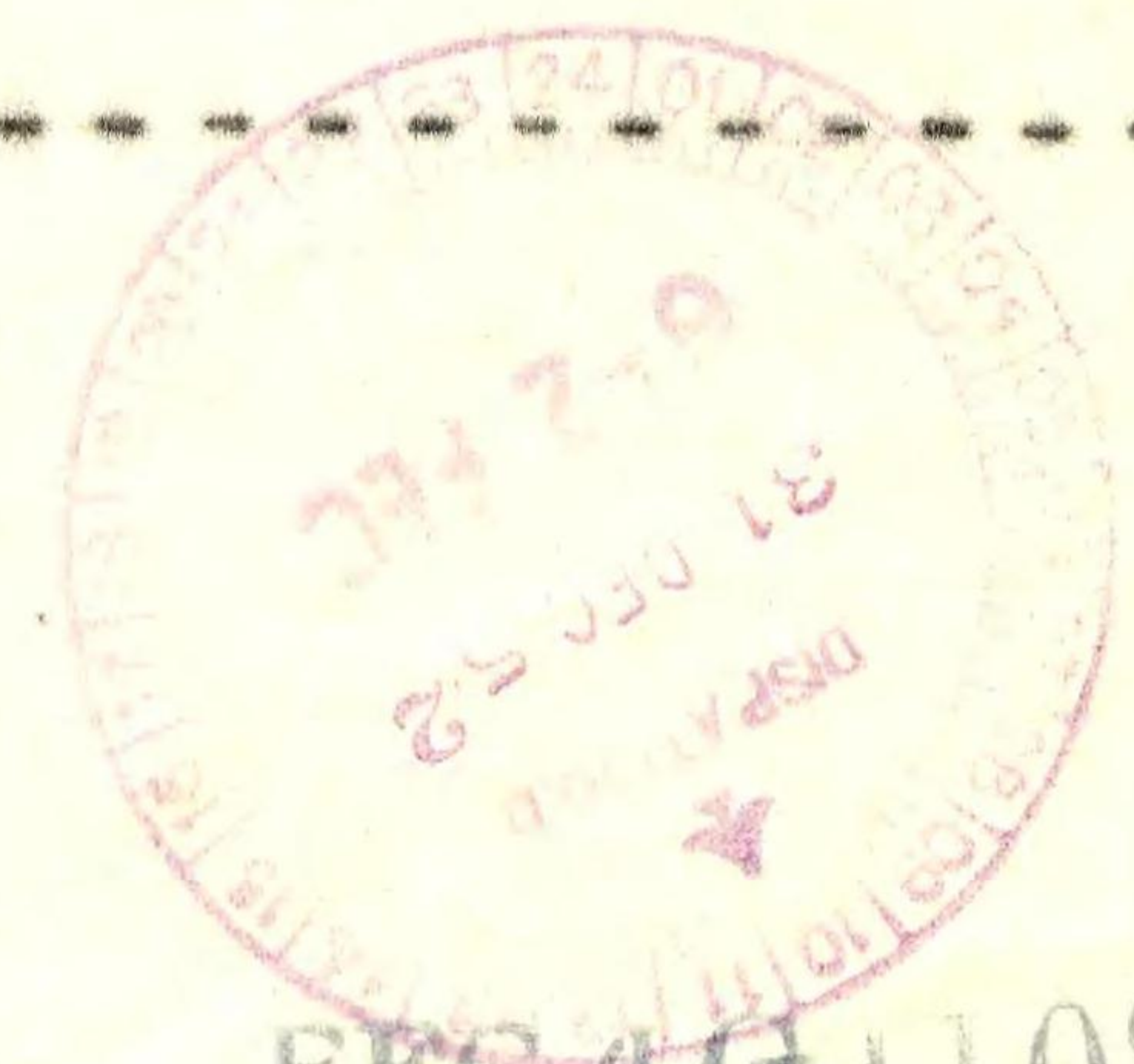

1. Reference proposed letter on channels of communication relating to CCRAK activities, it appears that a clarification of the relationship between FEC/LG and CCRAK and FEC/LG and G2 is desirable.
2. CCRAK is a joint command under direct command of CINCFE and under the operational control of G2. No command relationship exists between FEC/LG and CCRAK.
3. FEC/LG is an operating unit and not a staff section or a portion of a staff section - special or general. It has a status similar to the 441st CIC and the 500th MISG.
4. FEC/LG has no more command authority over CCRAK than Doc Res does, yet both give administrative and logistic support to units within CCRAK.
5. FEC/LG being a command and not a part of the G2 General Staff Section should not (and cannot legally) handle staff actions for the ACofS, G2. This incidentally applies to the 441st CIC and 500th MISG. It is believed that matters of policy, command relationship, etc. involving any or all of these organizations should be handled within G2 with advice, guidance and assistance in technical matters from FEC/LG, 500th MISG, etc.

1. Bob Eunson, Chief of the Associated Press Bureau in Tokyo, and the undersigned have had several talks concerning the methods employed by the Communists to monitor the voicecasts, morsecasts and other information channels supplying the large wire services, which have heavy 24-hour traffic from and to Japan. Use of this information is reflected in the Communist broadcasts.

2. Following airmail letter has been received by Eunson from Harold Turnblad, Chief of the Associated Press Bureau in San Francisco:

" It is evident that the Communists not only monitor our Tokyo morsecasts but also the RTT channels between Tokyo and San Francisco in both directions. Peiping radio makes fairly frequent references to stories in our outgoing service and yesterday they referred to material which was handled only in a service message from Tokyo to San Francisco.

This means that we will have to use the greatest discretion on what we put on our circuits. For one thing we do not want to endanger the safety of Pappy Noel ( a POW ).

The only really safe route is airmail. On matters that are urgent, the safest route seems to be via RCA because it uses multiplex equipment which the Chinese Communists may not have unless they have been supplied by Moscow. Moscow uses equipment which matches RCA's but the RCA people here are inclined to believe that the Chinese still are able to copy only single channel radioteleprinter circuits".

3. Eunson says he can think of no solution to this problem; airmail is of course too slow for many of the wire service's service messages.

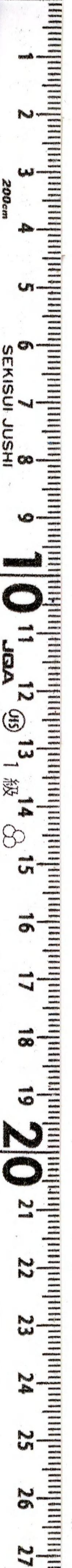

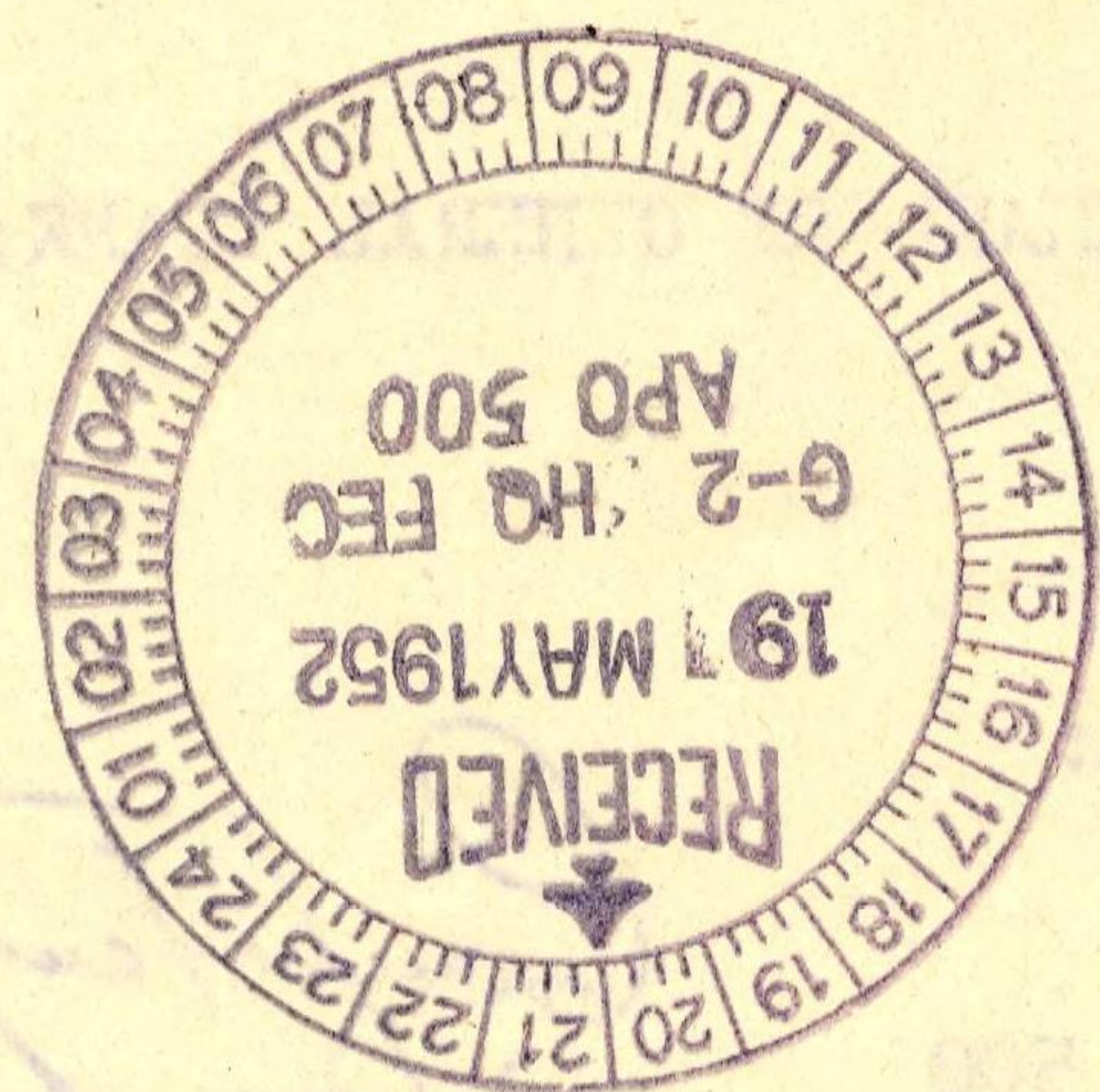

1. Basic: Proposed Command Letter approving designated circuits at Misawa and Itazuke Air Force Bases for the transmission of classified information in the clear.

d. Reference B stated that the circuits at Misawa, Itazuke and Johnson Air Force Bases had been inspected by representatives of GHQ, ASAPAC and AFSS and that the circuits could be approved, providing certain discrepancies were corrected.

e. Reference C stated that all deficiencies at Misawa and Itazuke Air Force Bases were corrected and FEAF requested approval of the circuits.

4. Action Indicated: Prepare and forward a Command Letter to Commanding General, Far East Air Forces approving the circuits at Misawa and Itazuke Air Force Bases for the transmission of classified information (except Top Secret) in the clear.

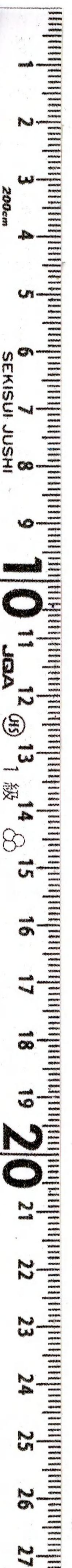

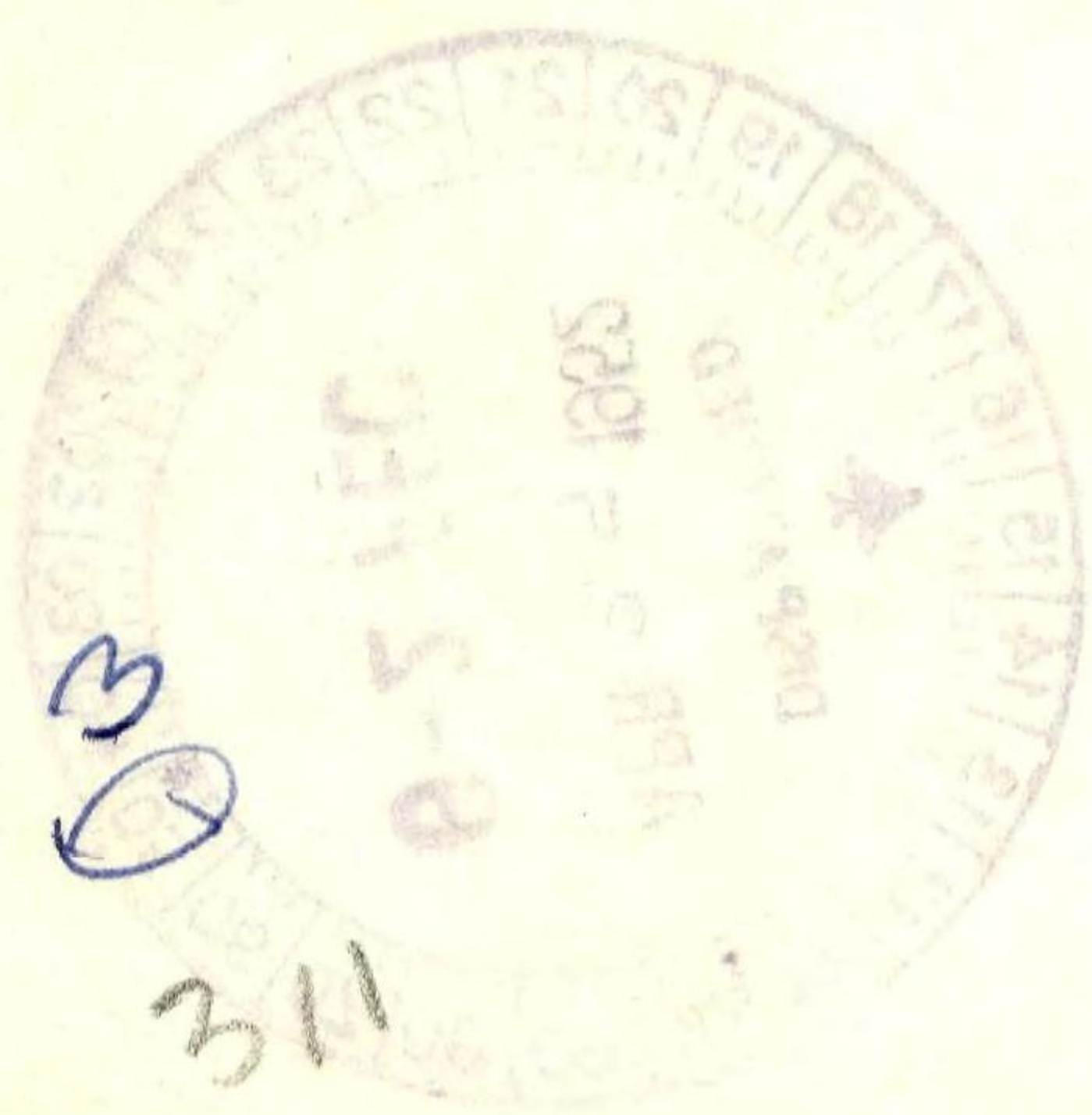

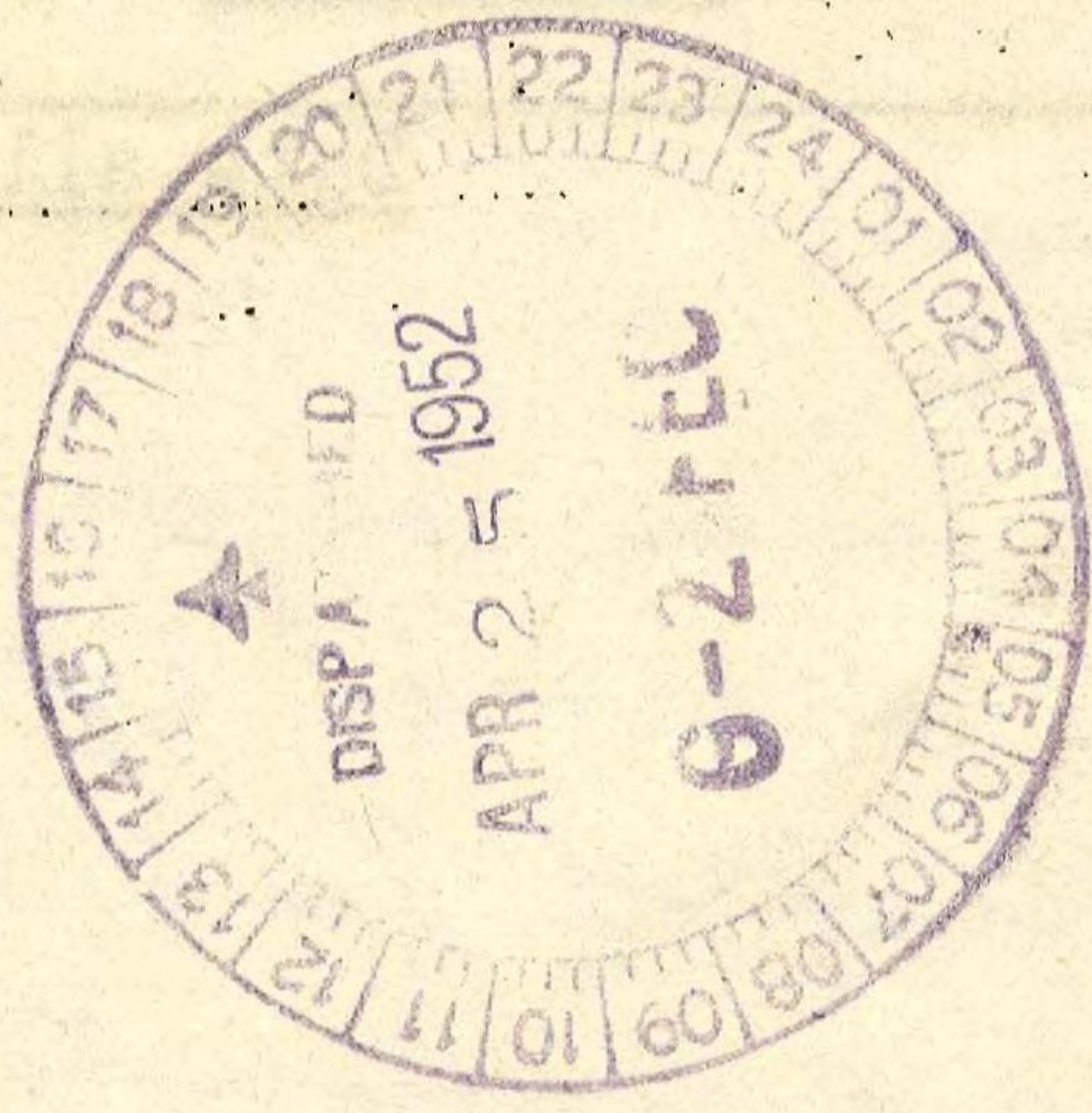
