


### WikiChallenge African Schools

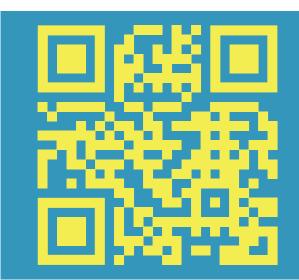
An annual writing contest that uses WikiFundi to challenge primary schools to write local articles on Vikidia.
