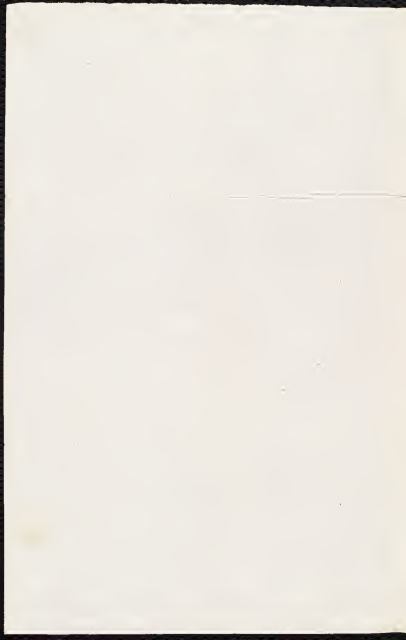

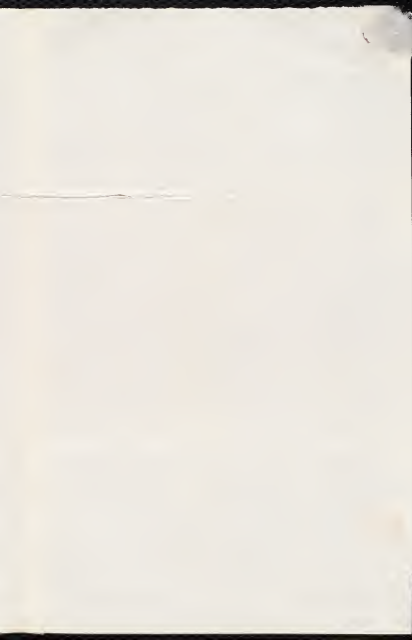
Dear Miss Weston
