

One group averaged 32M-18 incendiary clusters fused to separate at 5,000 feet, and

One group averaged 56 M-81 fragmentation bombs fused instantaneously.

39 planes dropped 239.4 short tons on ammo dumps and 37 planes dropped 272 short tons on Cantonment area in formations of from 1 to 15 aircraft at altitudes from 26,400 to 30,500.

Nil (15%) to meager (58%) to moderate (27%) and inaccurate (73%) to accurate (27%) black and some white heavy antiaircraft fire was encountered for 100 aircraft runs made from 0252Z to 0516Z at true altitudes of 27,200 to 32,200 feet over 0/10 to 5/10 undercast conditions. One enemy aircraft was reported on the same course and altitude (out of range to the right) by Formation #3 during the first run between 0254Z and 0256Z. The following table shows aircraft over the area in relation at time and heavy AA fire encountered:

For aircraft attacking the MINGALADON Cantonment Area heavy fire commence on an average of 2.2 minutes before bomb release and continued until 1.6 minutes following release. For those aircraft bombing Dumps "C" and "E" fire started on an average of 1 minute before release and continued until 1.5 minutes following the bombs away time.

After correlating the times of engagement with the altitudes and headings of approach and the known gun defense at RANGOON and MINGALADON, it appears that fire was of longer duration than expected from either the 75mm M88 or 120mm M10, assuming that all bursts were accurate. This, however, the enemy was unable to accomplish, the apparent increase in times of engagement being caused by the observation and reporting of bursts that were short either in altitude or slant range. The Flak Officer, 40th Bomb Group, reports, "As the formation (Number 2) settled into the bomb run about 20 bursts of heavy AA were observed at a position in the sky approximately over MINGALADON Airfield although no B-29s were observed in the vicinity. Fire was first encountered by this formation about one-half minute before bomb release time and continued until 1½ minutes after bombs away. All bursts of AA were black, except one white burst, reported by the plane in #3 position of "D" flight, which was high, behind and to the right of the aircraft. Bursts were for the most part from 500 - 2000 feet below the formation, although several bursts were reported level or just below the aircraft. The fire was accurate for course and speed of the formation, generally speaking.....The majority of crews in the formation reported "tracking" or continuous pointed fire, although several crews stated that bursts clustered enough to evidence predicted concentration of fire. Since bursts were observed continuously against the formation while over the target, it appears that the majority were correct in opinion of fire type."

Referring to Formation #4 which attacked on a heading of 182°M exposing itself to fire from the MINGALADON Area as well as the defenses in the northern sections of RANGOON, the Flak Officer, 40th Group, stated, "Antiaircraft fire was encountered about 1½ minutes before bomb release time and continued for approximately three minutes. Crew reports of this formation indicate that the bursts were slightly more intense than against the first formation and can be rated as moderate and inaccurate. Conflicts again existed between crew opinions as to the type of fire employed by the enemy with the majority once again in favor of continuous pointed. The same general conditions existed for the second formation as for the first formation with bursts falling off below our altitude."

As stated in AA Opposition Report, Mission #44, no evidence was obtained indicating employment of heavy guns with greater capabilities than the 75mm M88 or 120mm M10.

B-I-2

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The number of bursts observed at one instant varied from 3 to 8 resulting in a total of from 8 to 75 for any encounter. All crews observed black bursts, while 5 observed white flak. As for Mission #44, the type of fire could not be definitely determined although the majority (48%) favored predicted concentration as opposed to 35 percent reporting continuously pointed fire. It is known, however, that the enemy did not resort to barrage fire.

R.C.M. Observers intercepted tracking signals with gun-laying radar characteristics while under fire over RANGOON-MINGALADON. Evidence obtained through intercepts and D/F'ed locations provisionally establishes a gun-laying radar site inside the Rangoon defended area. Other "cuts" resulting in pin-points from 5 to 20 miles from the RANGOON-MINGALADON Area were obtained. That the enemy was employing gun-laying radar to provide firing data is quite certain, but because of limitations of guns and fire control equipment it is evident that he did not benefit through its application. R.C.M. Report, Mission #45, this Headquarters, includes detailed information relating to the signal characteristics, D/F'ed locations, etc. of these gun-laying radar intercepts.

None.

D. WARNING NETS

Although no early warning radar installations were in operation in the RANGOON Area, it is possible that the enemy obtained some warning from his visual net, or late warning from the Gun-laying sets active during the attack (as determined by R.C.M. Observers).

Following is a detailed description of enemy fighter opposition encountered on Mission No. 45

I. Japanese Fighter Tactics - Mission No. 45  
Target: Mingaladon Area near Rangoon, Burma.  
Time: Day Mission 22 March 1945.

There was no air opposition reported in the target area although from 2 to 3 single-engine planes, presumably enemy, were sighted. One attack by a twin-engine plane, identified as a Nick, was made at a point 17 degrees 20'N - 95 degrees 35'E roughly 60 miles west and north of Rangoon. The B-29 was flying singly, at 29,000 feet, when the Nick approached between 6 and 7 o'clock, level. The B-29 opened fire at 1000 yards but reported no hits. The Nick broke away at 6 o'clock in a peel-off, and was not seen again. There were no other encounters.



