The mission of this flight was again to deny the enemy the use of airfields in the Amami Gunto. No encounter with the enemy took place.

Photo reconnaissance had revealed operational planes very skillfully hidden in woods and camouflaged under trees around the A/P on the S.W. side of Kikai. Rockets and strafing tactics were used against areas where planes were concealed. Results unobserved and weather unfavorable.
