

## 總論

打字雖小技,不習不能.而習之不得其法,斷不能精.學者常以爲打字無專習之必要,隨意行之,不幾月而技成矣. 此實大謬.打字循學書,猶習琴,欲手指之敏捷,肌肉之發達, 必須經過有規程之練習.不然,一部分之疏忽,卽不能收良 好之效果.故隨意學者,其速率有限,而易致錯誤.不可不戒 之.

凡事愈瑣屑,愈易輕忽本書目的,在養成完全之技術, 所有實習,由淺入深.學者宜不憚煩勞,不辭難易,依序習之, 然後能臻神妙之境.

打字機構造 打字機種類繁多,構造各異本書概不 細述著者亦不欲指出某機之優點,某機之缺點,以免不公 正之評論

舊製打字機多屬暗式 (invisible type). 所打之字,皆不能見,必須將蓋掀起,始能見之此式機已成過去之物.通常所用,皆係明式 (visible type).

of the

#### REPUBLIC OF CHINA

(Promulgated in 1912)

#### I. General Provisions

Article 1 .- The Republic of China is established by the Chinese people.

Article 2 .- The sovereignty of the Chinese Republic is vested in the whole body of the people.

Article 3 .- The territory of the Chinese Republic consists of the twenty-two provinces, Inner and Outer Mongolia, Tibet and Chinghai (Koko Nor).

Article 4 .- The sovereignty of the Chinese Republic is exercised by the National Council, the Provisional President, the Cabinet, and the Judiciary.

#### II. Citizens

Article 5 .- Citizens of the Chinese Republic are all equal, and there shall be no racial, class or religious distinctions.

Article 6.- Citizens shall enjoy the following rights:

- (1) No citizen shall be arrested, imprisoned, tried or punished
- except in accordance with the Law.
  (2) The habitation of any citizen shall not be entered or searched, except in accordance with Law.
- (3) Citizens shall enjoy the right of the security of their property and the freedom of trade.
  (4) Citizens shall have the freedom of speech, of publication, of
- association.
  - (5) Citizens shall have the right of the secrecy of their letters. (6) Citizens shall have the liberty of residence and removed. (7) Citizens shall have the freedom of religion.

Article 7 .- Citizens shall have the right to petition Parliament.

The walls are hung with theatrical engravings and photographs: Kemble as Hamlet, Mrs. Siddons as Queen Katharine pleading in court, Macready as Werner (after Maclise) Sir Henry Irving as Richard III (after Long), Miss Ellen Terry, Mrs. Kendal, Miss Ada Rehan, Madame Sarah Bernhardt, Mr. Henry Arthur Jones, Mr. A. W. Finero, Mr. Sydney Grundy, and so on, but not the Signora Duse or any one connected with Ibsen. The room is not rectangular, one corner being cut off diagonally by the doorway, and the opposite one rounded by a turret window filled up with a stand of flowers surrounding a statuette of Shakespeare. The fireplace is on the doorway side, with an armchair near it. A small round table, further from the door on the same side, with a chair beside it, has a yellow backed French novel lying open on it. The planc, a grand, is on the Shakespeare side, open, with the keyboard at right angles to the wall. The piece of music on the desk is "When Other Lips." Incandescent lights, well shaded, are on the piano and mantelpiece. Near the piano is a sofa, on which the lady and gentleman are seated af-

fectionately side by side, in one another's arms.

The lady, Grace Tranfield, is about 32, slight of build, delicate of feature, and sensitive in expression. She is just now given up to the emotion of the moment; but her well closed mouth proudly set brows, firm chin, and elegant carriage show plenty of determination

and self-respect. She is in evening dress.

The gentleman, Leonard Charteris, a few years older, is unconventionally but smartly dressed in a velvet jacket and cashmere trousers. #### CARBUNCLES

Carbuncles are most frequently situated about the back of the neck, . at the edge of the hair-covered area, and in nearly all cases require surgical treatment. When operating, the common mistake is to make the incision far too small. The skin must be shaved for some little distance round the carbuncle, which should be freely opened by two incisions crossing each other at right angles, care being taken that all the area of hardness is opened up by the incisions. If the inflammatory condition has shown a tendency to spread, the quadrants of skin marked out by the incisions must be raised, and the septic focus beneath them thoroughly opened up. A blunt curette and forceps can be used to remove the slough, but care should be taken not to destroy the wall of granulation tissue which protects the rest of the system from infection. No stitches are inserted, the wound being dressed with hot fomentations; these are changed frequently, and will speedily cause the carbuncle to heal, if it has been thoroughly opened. As the inflammation extends under the skin, superficially rather than deeply, any spreading of the septic process can be recognized


