The Dumfries and Galloway Primary Care National Health Service Trust(Establishment) Amendment Order 1999

Coming into force - - 1st October 1999

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred on them bysection 12A(1) and (4) of and paragraphs 1 and 3(1)(b) and (c) of Schedule7A to, the National Health Service (Scotland) Act 1978(1) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the followingOrder:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Dumfries and Galloway Primary CareNational Health Service Trust (Establishment) Amendment Order 1999 and shall come into force on 1st October 1999.
 - (2) In this Order–

"the principal Order" means the Dumfries and Galloway Primary CareNational Health Service Trust (Establishment) Order 1998(2).

Amendment of the principal Order

2.—(1) For article 3 of the principal Order there is substituted—

"Nature and functions of the trust

- **3.**—(1) The trust is established for the purpose specified in section 12A(1) of the Act.
- (2) The trust's functions shall be-
 - (a) to provide goods and services for the purpose of the Health Service at, from or through hospital accommodation and facilities at Annan Hospital, Annan, Dalrymple Hospital, Stranraer and Annan Crichton Royal Hospital and Nithbank Hospital, both Dumfries, and at establishments associated withthose hospitals, and also

- including the management of any teaching andresearch facilities associated with those establishments and the supportservices related thereto;
- (b) in so far as not included in paragraph (a) above, to make arrangements for the provision of services mentioned in Part II of the Act; and
- (c) to carry out the primary and community health care functions of Dumfries and Galloway Health Board under the following Regulations—
 - (i) The National Health Service (Dental Charges) (Scotland) Regulations 1989(3);
 - (ii) The National Health Service (Optical Charges and Payments) (Scotland)Regulations 1998(4);
 - (iii) The National Health Service (Charges for Drugs and Appliances)(Scotland) Regulations 1989(5);
 - (iv) The National Health Service (Travelling Expenses and Remission of Charges) (Scotland) Regulations 1988(6).".
- (2) In article 4 of the principal Order (directors of the trust) for thewords "non executive directors" there is substituted "trustees".
