CITY AND STATE NEWS IN BRIEF

When Mrs. Wilfred Siminaux, residing near Franklin, attempted to fill an oil stove while it was burning, the stove exploded, setting fire to her clothing, burning up the residence and incinerating her four-month-old infant before assistance could be given.

Mayor Behrman introduced an ordinance into the council Tuesday to prohibit disorderly houses anywhere in the city of New Orleans. The ordinance provides for the removal of occupants of any premises where violations of the law may be found, and it prohibits the renting or leasing of any property for such purposes.

News was received at Lake Charles by William J. Martin of the death of his nephew, Donald McL. Jacob, who was killed in action in Flanders, August 21, 1917. Jacob was a member of the Canadian forces. In April, 1916, Jacob was seriously wounded on the western front, but on recovering went back to the front. He enlisted in the fall of 1915 after a number of fruitless efforts. He was the first Lake Charles man killed in the war.
