"SNAPS" For Greenhouse Forcing

Snapdragon being one of the leading Florist Greenhouse crops, we have followed very closely the development of the Winter Flowering or Forcing type and offer the following approved varieties.

From observations made of the Greenhouse Snapdragons herein listed, we wish to make the following recommendations of popular sorts in regard to early flowering winter varieties, intermediate and late flowering spring varieties. Each type is good under certain conditions. Early types planted in the south, with more light, will set buds earlier and not make suitable spikes but for winter flowering during the dark days in our latitude early types should be used, and for after "Mums" and spring blooming use the intermediate and late varieties. First sowings are usually made between June 10th and July 10th and selection of varieties according to locality and climatic conditions.

The soil for growing snapdragons should be porous and well drained. Raised benches are preferable to ground beds and especially for winter crop. High nutrition, especially nitrogen, and high moisture combined during the dark days should be avoided as the results will be soft growth and off-colored shattery flowers

For after "Mums" and spring crop, when later and stronger growing varieties are planted, ground beds may be used to better advantage for with the lengthening days and higher temperatures come better growing conditions. Early varieties usually are planted 7x8 in, and later and heavier sorts 8x8 in.

The Early Whites include the new Junglewood White originated by the Junglewood Greenhouses of Mount Morrison, Colorado and is illustrated in color on the cover of this list with single floret shown in natural size. At its debut at a meeting of the New York Florist Club last winter it was awarded a silver medal. Sample blooms sent us early in January had clear white flower spikes measuring 20 to 22 inches on heavy stiff stems.

Koester's White and White Wonder Improved are the earliest pure whites, the latter being slightly heavier. Margaret is an ivory white of fine spike, having same type growth as Mary Ellen pink but with closer set florets. Feist's White is a clear white, a true sport of Cheviot Maid pink and should find favor with ones who grow the latter. Next in earliness is Schlegel's White, followed by Peace, a pure paper white, larger than White Wonder with close set florets. Lucky Strike, the old favorite, is still grown by many for early, midseason and late but being heavier in growth it does not produce as much in winter. Lucky Strike Improved is not as heavy but slightly earlier and a decided improvement. Early Westover's White is an early selection of this late sort. Marion White, Schaffroth White, are fine for after "Mums" or spring blooming.

In the early Pinks, Christmas Cheer is unquestionably the finest rose pink. Better Times is a beautiful deep rose. Mary Ellen and Maryland Pink are two fine pastel pinks, the latter having a slightly closer set spike. These four are all first-cross hybrids from known parentage, excellent early varieties and croppers. Yoders No. 33 is a fine early light pink of Mary Ellen type. Rose Pink Cheviot is superseded by Christmas Cheer.

In the next, or intermediate type, the most popular are Cheviot Maid Reselected, Rose Queen and Gilbert Pink Supreme. Cheviot Supreme Appleblossom, La France and Daybreak fit in here. This group can be planted for winter flowering but the early sorts are more productive in our latitude during dark winter days.

For after "Mums" Peggy Schumann is a fine salmon rose with heavy stems and fine spikes. Schaffroth Pink is another. Marie Louise and St. Louis are fine light pinks. America, Terry's Surprise and New Cincinnati fit in here.

The new Canadian variety **Delworth's Supreme**, a selection of Cheviot Maid comes well recommended.

In the Bronzes, the earliest are Sunlight and Sun Tan, the first being a little lighter in color. Afterglow, which is slightly later, is the most popular having a heavier spike and deeper coloring. Bronze Christmas Cheer, not as early as its name would imply, later and of heavier growth and spike, as is Talisman, the nearest all-double, is an early bloomer and retail novelty. For after "Mums" and spring are Glorious, a dark Afterglow, and Kirkwood Beauty. Ideal Improved, with its contrasting white throat, comes in this group.

In the Yellows, the earliest are Ceylon Court Dark Selection, Yellow Wonder, which does not make any too large a spike, and Goldie which resembles a shorter Ceylon Court. Schlegel's Yellow not as dark in color, comes next in blooming, followed by Ethel the most popular yellow on the market for winter and spring. Carol Jean is in season with Ethel, larger flower and a shade lighter, but is coming more in demand. To follow "Mums" for spring flowering are Yellow Peggy, another Schumann introduction, with good stem and spike and Coates' Yellow Perfection, Klondyke Supreme, and Sunray in the lilac or lavender, Windmiller Lilac is the earliest. Bertha Baur, Ball and Schumann Lavender are later and to be planted only after "Mums" as probably all in this class should. Schumann Lavender is by far the most popular for stem and spike.

Velvet Supreme is taller and later and supersedes Christmas Red for after "Mums."



For Calceolarias, use a mixture of loam, leaf-mold and sharp sand. This mixture is suit-able both for the seed pans and the pots into which the secdlings, when ready, should be planted. Perfect drainage is important. Calceolaria seed being very fine the seeding should be done with great care and it is suggested that one use a sheet of white paper on which a tablespoon of white sand is distributed. Then shake the seed on top of this sand and mix thoroughly. Then, sprinkle this mixture on the soil of the seed pan, dusting surface with a little fine sand, cover with a sheet of glass and place in the shade. For moisture, immerse the pans in water. As the seedlings come up lift them carefully when quite small and prick them off into a flat allowing two inches square for each plant. It is important that the Icaves of one plant should never be allowed to overlap those of another or decay will probably result. When established in pots shift them into the larger size. At the last shift give them some manure water, not too strong, about once a week.


