

# Wikipedia for Peace – Logic Model

## Situation

Can we recruit new volunteers by partnering with other international non-profit networks which do not come from the online world but share our belief that free knowledge makes the world better? WMAT has been exploring this with the Service Civil International (SCI) a global peace movement

## Priorities

Recruiting more volunteers for Wikimedia projects (esp. women, members of emerging communities and minority languages)  
Contributing free knowledge to topics which support more peaceful societies (e.g. environmental justice)

## INPUTS

**What we invest**

Staff and volunteer time to host peace camps and train the trainer events for camp hosts

Travel support for interested volunteers from Austria

Cross-pollination between the volunteering cultures of SCI and Wikimedia (how each other's values volunteer approaches can be integrated into and thereby enrich one's own projects)	SCI volunteers become Wikimedians or even organize wiki projects in their home communities	Global cooperation of Wikimedia and SCI volunteers which leads to more diverse communities in many countries and new joint ideas and projects
Awareness for peace related topics among Wikimedians	Wikimedians value the grassroots approach of SCI volunteers (e.g. simple housing& home cooking during projects)& their inclusive approach to women and minorities
