


- 2. Incl 2 of Incl 1, paragraph II, states that the petitioner is a dealer in scrap iron; paragraph III, 3, states that he has been leading an idle life since the war. An explanation of this discrepancy is desired.

Forwarded herewith, petition from Ri Sho Raku for the release of his wife, Kin Jun-I, currently detained at the Omura Immigration Center, with report of investigation by the Kobukuro Municipal Police Headquarters. 2. Police Report confirms the petitioner's ability to support Kin Jun-I. He is reported to have a monthly income of \$20,000 and property valued at ¥1,090,000. 3. Although the petitioner has an unsavory character reputation and police record of law violation according to police report, no adverse mention is made therein concerning the detainee, Kin Jun-I, except the unproven suspicions mentioned in paragraph VII.
