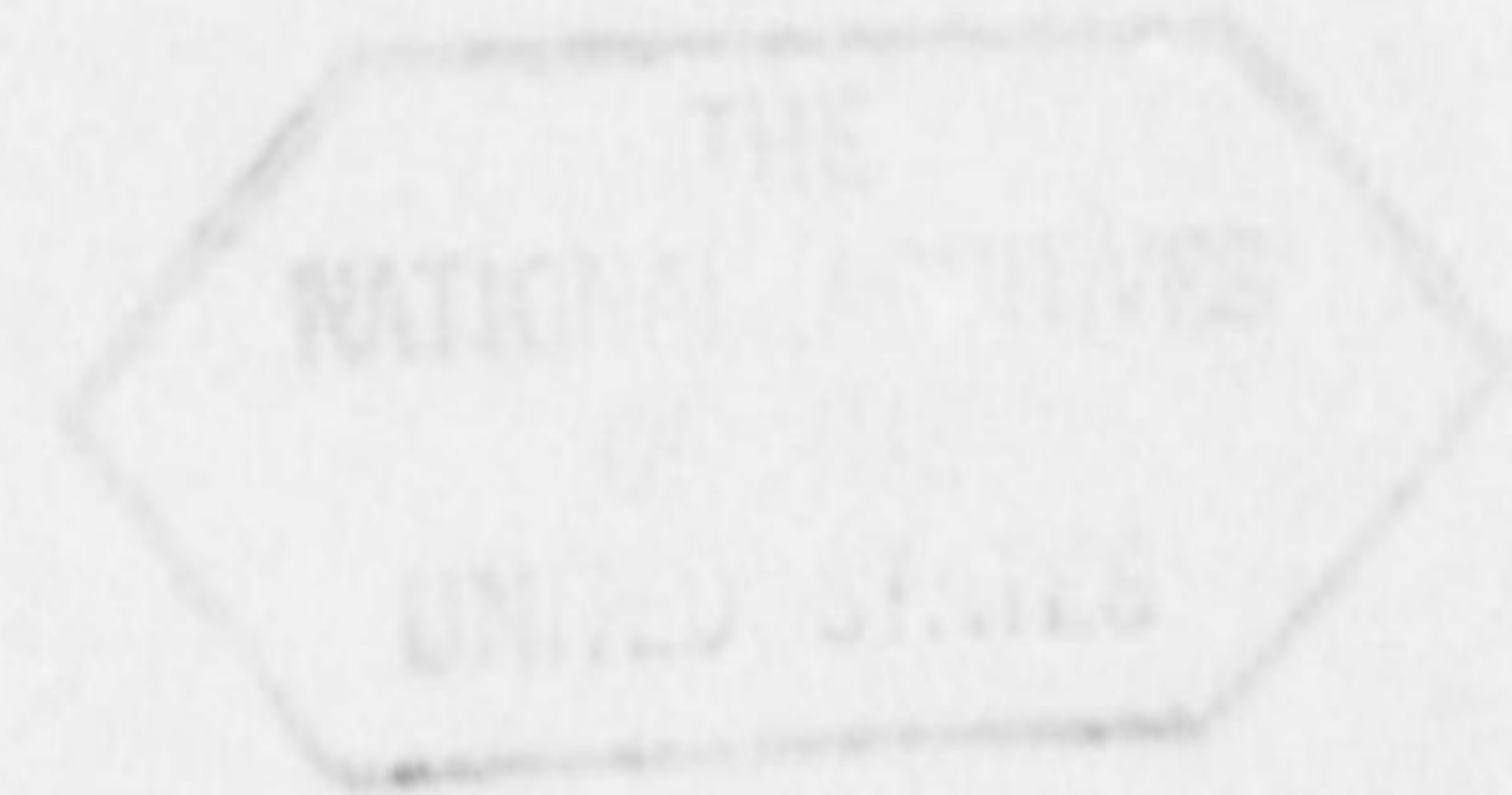

1. The following JNPR manuals have not been received at Camp Zentsuji. Training in these subjects has started and the manuals are urgently needed. The U.S. Army equivalent is given since the JNPR designation is unknown.

FM-21-25	Elementary Map Reading
FM-21-30	Conventional Signs
FM-21-105	Engineer Handbook
FM-30-5	Military Intelligence
FM-30-15	Examination of Enemy Personnel
FM-30-25	Counter Intelligence

2. There is also an urgent need for at least 50 - Compasses and 250 maps each of sheet number 4849-1 and 4850-11, Southern Honshu, 1:50,000 or 1:10,000 (preferably of the Zentsuji area but at least some kind of maps - Japanese or American) for teaching map reading. Barbed wire and pickets are needed for field fortifications.

3. Request information as to the training program to be used upon the completion of the basic training period.

4. Subject tests are being made up locally, however, information is desired as to whether or not an examination on the entire basic training period will be prepared and supplied from your office. If examination is to be prepared locally, what type of examination (written or practical) is desired? Will passing of the comprehensive test be made a prerequisite for retention in the JNPR?





MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD: -

1. The following instructions were given to Lt Col Johnston, Shikoku Civil Affairs Region this date:

a. Expand Camp Zentsuji to maximum capacity of 4000 at an overall cost for rehabilitation of the entire camp not to exceed 14,000,000 yen.

b. Develop Camp Kochi to a capacity of 3000 at a cost not to exceed 15,000,000 yen. Make every effort to get cost of rehabilitation down to 12,000,000 yen. If the town does not voluntarily offer to move the school now on the premises, or if it appears that any criticism would develop as a result of the school being moved, make no objection to the school remaining in a portion of the area and develop the remainder of the area to take 2000 enlistees at a cost not to exceed 10,000,000 yen. Every effort is to be made to reduce this cost to 8,000,000 yen.

c. Instructions will be issued later concerning rehabilitation of Camp Tokashima.

d. You will be advised as to plans for moving additional enlistees to Zentsuji. Estimated time of arrival will be furnished. Information as to arrival of enlistees at Kochi will also be furnished later.

1. This letter confirms information furnished you by telephone relative to National Police Reserve instructors for company administrative personnel.
2. Graduates of a school established at this headquarters for the purpose of training personnel officers have been assigned to your area. It is desired that a school for company administrative personnel - first sergeants and company clerks - be established at each camp. Graduates referred to above will be used as instructors.
3. It is desired that the school begin on 25 September and continue for a period of two weeks. The course will be repeated until all companies or similar units have been provided with a trained and well qualified first sergeant and company clerk.
