Request by DOHIHARA, Kenji

Was Chief of Liaison Bureau in Nanking, China at end of war. Believed to be there as Chinese P.W., at present possibly in Nagano Ku.

This witness served under Dohihara while Dohihara was engaged in activities in North China and testimony principally concerns the establishmentsof the Autonomous Area in North China, about which the prosecution has already introduced evidence against the accused.

The testimony of this witness is believed to be relevant and is specifically concerned with Count 19.
