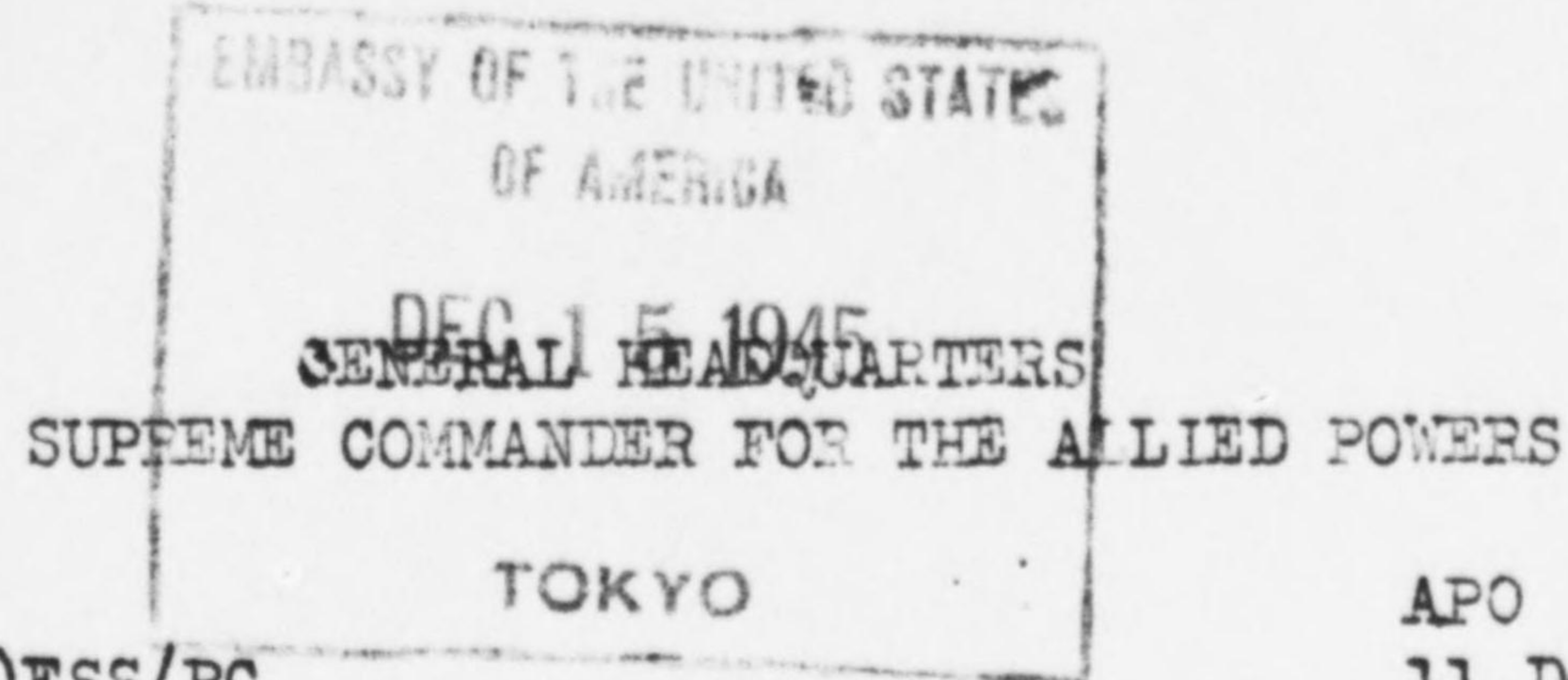

MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Report on Stocks of Staple Foodstuffs.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to inform this Headquarters when the stocks of staple foodstuffs in any city of more than 100,000 persons in the four main islands of Japan fall below ten days' supply. Staple foods will include; rice, wheat, millet, naked barley, covered barley, sweet potatoes, Irish potatoes, soy beans, and other beans.

2. At any time when the stocks of staple foodstuffs on hand in any of these cities is below ten days' supply, a daily report of the following information will be submitted to this Headquarters: (1) Actual stocks of staple foodstuffs on hand in terms of days of supply and in terms of metric tons of rice equivalents, (2) daily arrivals of rationed foodstuffs in terms of metric tons of rice equivalents, (3) daily distribution in terms of metric tons of rice equivalents.

2. Applications No. 008, 009, 010, and 012 are denied and the funds concerned will remain blocked.

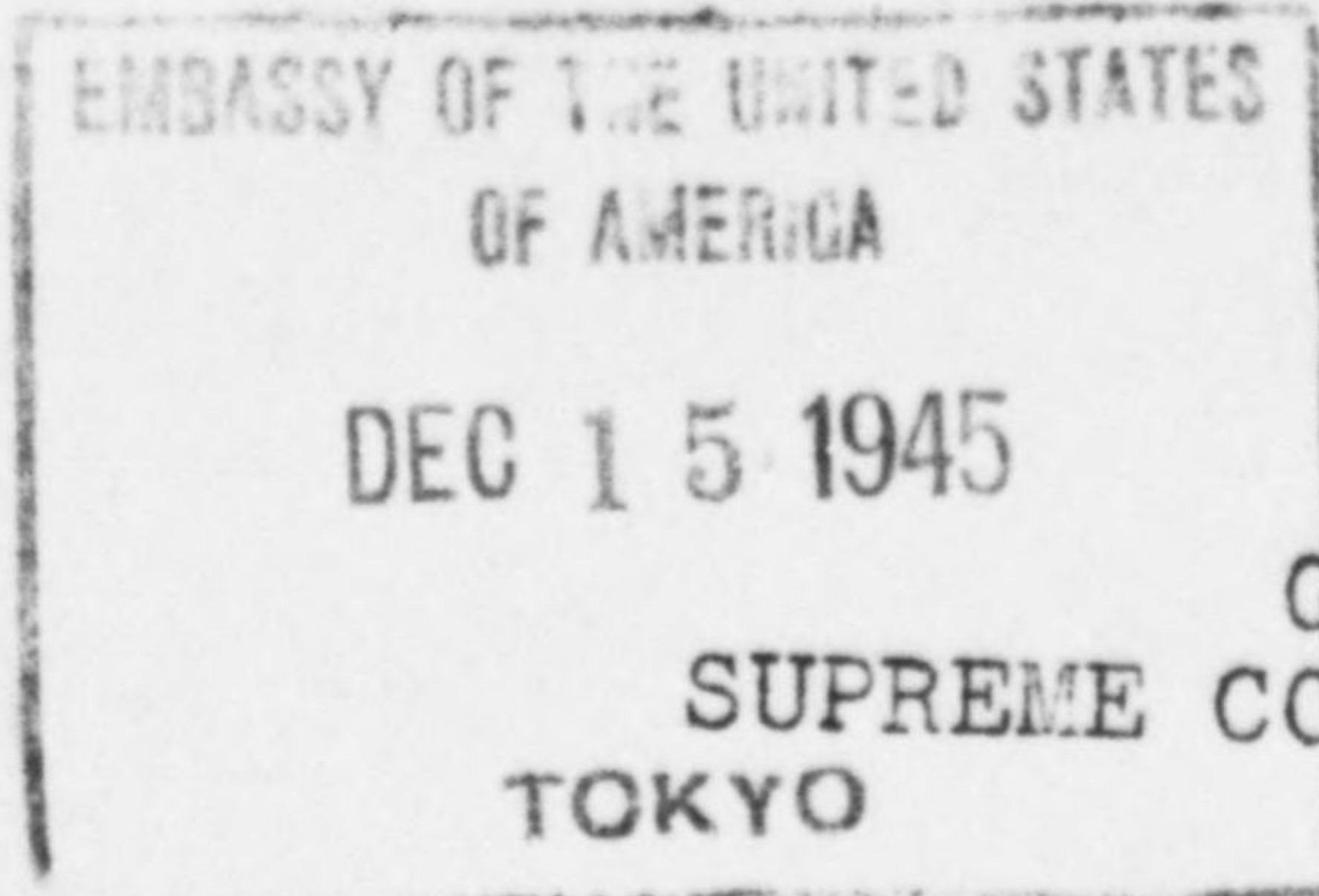

 SUBJECT: Use of Highways by U. S. Army.

1. A study has been conducted to determine the probable general extent and severity of U.S. Army traffic upon the road system of Japan. The attached map shows in blue color the roads over which it is expected that the heaviest concentrations of Army traffic in each general area will pass. Roads indicated in red color will probably sustain medium amounts of Army traffic, while those left uncolored will sustain little or no Army traffic. This does not include short sections of road leading to unit bivouac areas and various other Army installations.

2. It is understood that the Road Section of the Public Works Bureau, under the Japanese Home Ministry is interested in this information in order to plan its overall post-war road expansion, rehabilitation and maintenance program. The attached map is furnished solely for information purposes in this respect and does not constitute a directive to the Japanese government to undertake construction, repair, or maintenance of any sort upon the road system. It merely indicates those roads which it may be expected will be subjected to the most deterioration from Army traffic under the present disposition of occupation forces.

3. Specific demands for repair, maintenance, and improvement of certain delineated sections of roads will continue to be placed by field agencies.

SUBJECT : Inventory of Raw Silk, Semi, Greige, and Finished Goods.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government require all owners, (including Imperial Japanese Government agencies), of raw silk bales intact, open bales, greige goods in the looms, greige goods, and finished goods both military and civilian fabrics (except those mentioned in CLO No. 519(2) dated 28 November 1945) make inventories of their stocks in accordance with instructions listed below.

2. Inventories will be made out in triplicate (3 copies) and contain the following information:

- a. Name, address and location of establishment.
- b. Owner.
- c. Total number unopened bales (will be listed by bale mark, grade, and denier).
- d. Total number opened bales (will be listed by bale mark, grade, denier), and estimated poundage in raw.
- e. Total yardage semi-finished greige goods on looms (will be listed according to warp yardage, construction, color, or greige) and number of looms in plant.
- f. Total yardage greige goods (will be listed giving construction, number of pieces, color or greige, and yardage).
- g. Total yardage finished goods (will be listed giving construction, number of pieces, color or greige, and yardage).

3. The above individual inventories will be submitted in triplicate (3 copies) to the Imperial Japanese Government not later than 15 January 1946.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible that:

- a. All agencies concerned under the terms of the directive have submitted the required inventories.
- b. Each inventory is correct and complete.

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

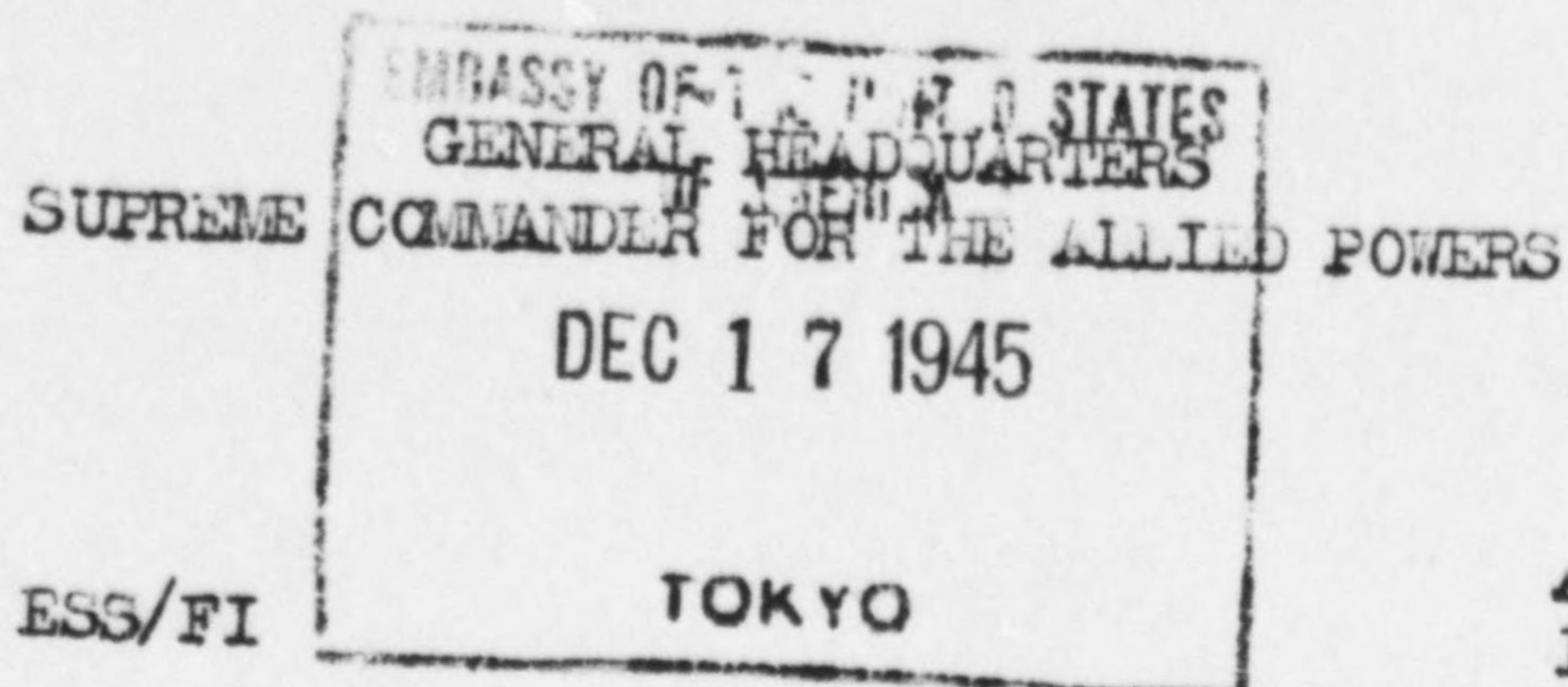
c. A master inventory is accomplished consolidating all individual inventories using the same form as prescribed in paragraph two (2) above.

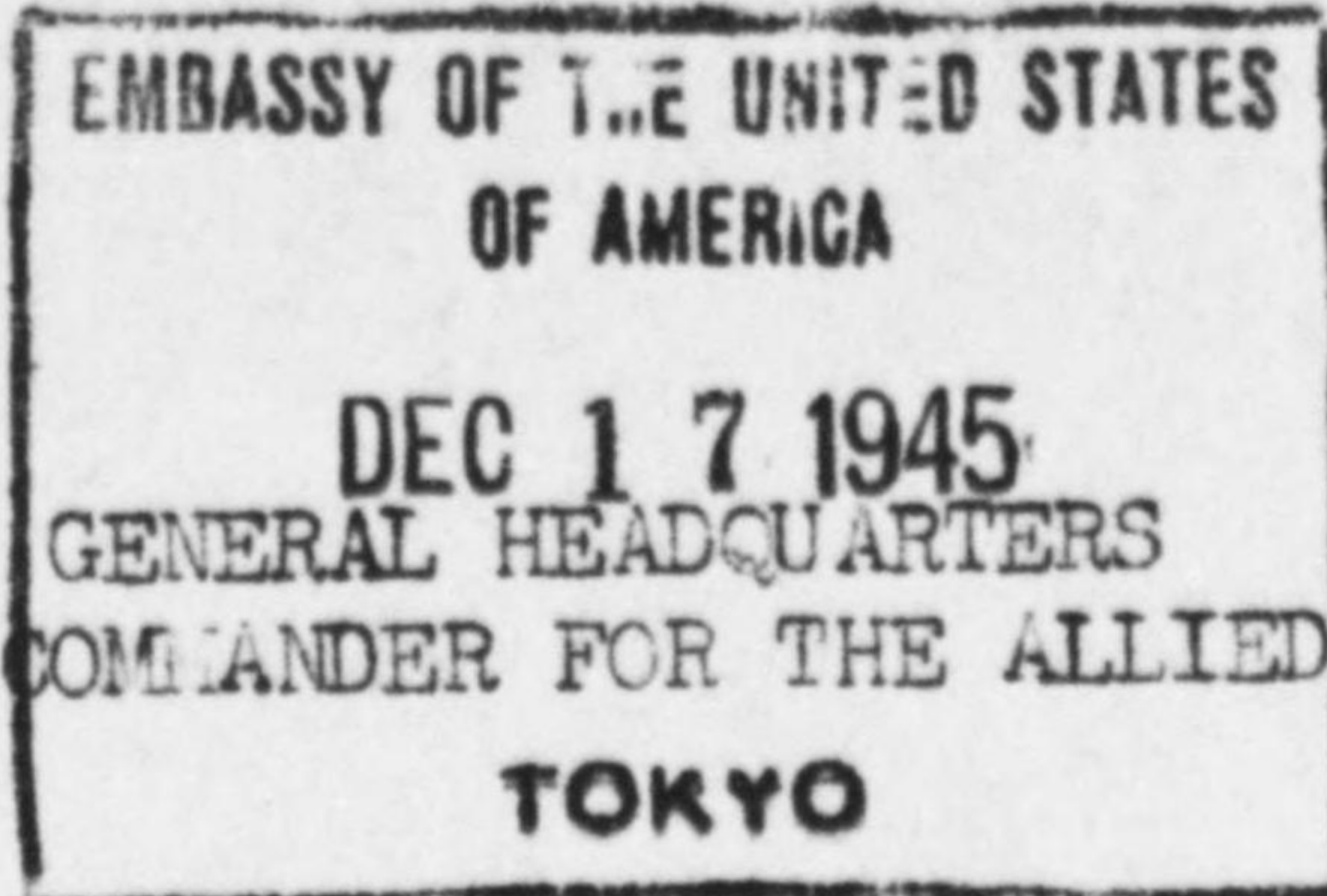

SUBJECT : Korean Repatriates in Maizuru Area.

1. This headquarters has been informed that there are 10,000 Koreans in the Maizuru area awaiting repatriation.
2. Instructions have been issued this date to the Commanding General, Sixth Army to permit repatriation of subject personnel by the Imperial Japanese Government.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will include the 10,000 Koreans, now at Maizuru, in their plans for repatriation of Koreans to Korea through ports in Kyushu.
4. It is emphasized that only those Koreans who express a desire to return to Korea will be repatriated.
5. The Imperial Japanese Government will evacuate these repatriates in accordance with the provisions of memorandum this headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 370.5 (17 Nov 45)GC, dated 17 November 1945, subject: "Repatriation of Non-Japanese from Japan."

2. The above reference is amended by adding sub-paragraph (3) to Par. 3d as follows:

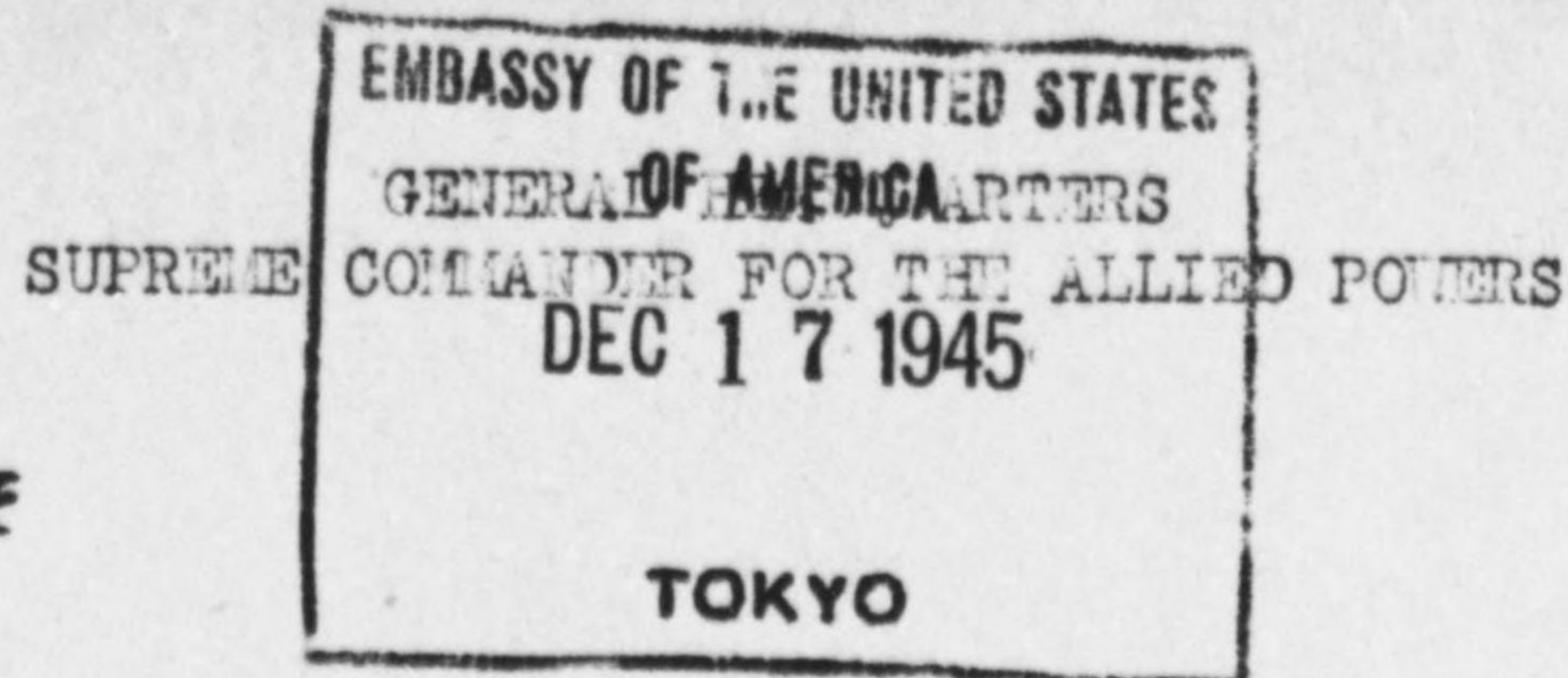

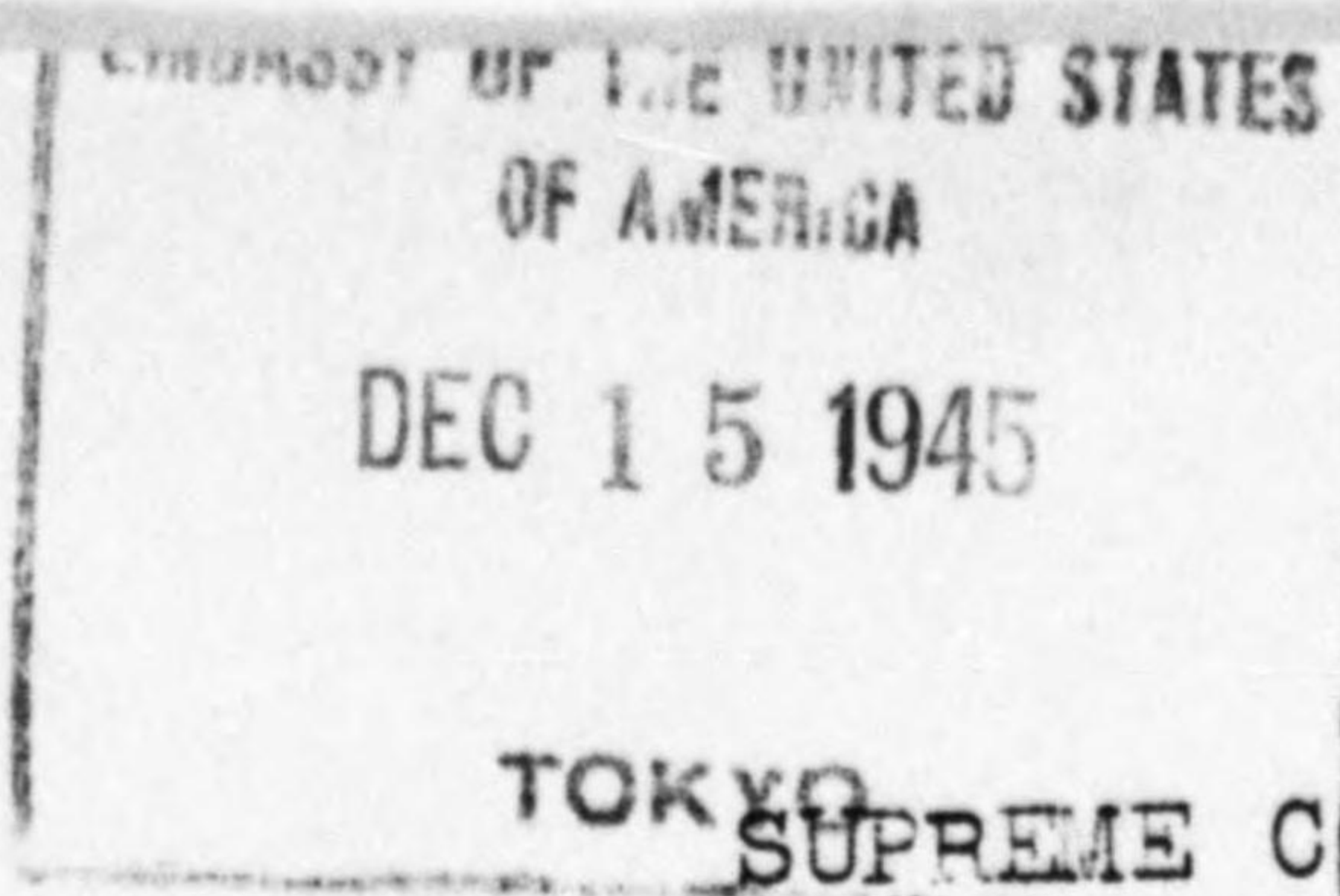

SUBJECT : Return of Essential Records and Engineering Data.

1. During the occupation of the Philippines by the Japanese, the National Power Corporation, Manila, was placed under the Taiwan Electric Company, whose head office is in Japan. Engineers of the Taiwan Electric Company, then assigned in the Philippines, made copies of essential hydrologic data of the principal power rivers of the Philippines. The National Power Corporation had also made project studies with preliminary plans for the development of power plants on several rivers in Luzon and the Lake Lanao-Agus River area in Mindanao. It is known that these hydrologic data and development plans were in the hands of the Japanese authorities.

2. You are directed to locate and deliver all such records and data referred to in par. 1 above to this Headquarters on or before 10 January 1946.

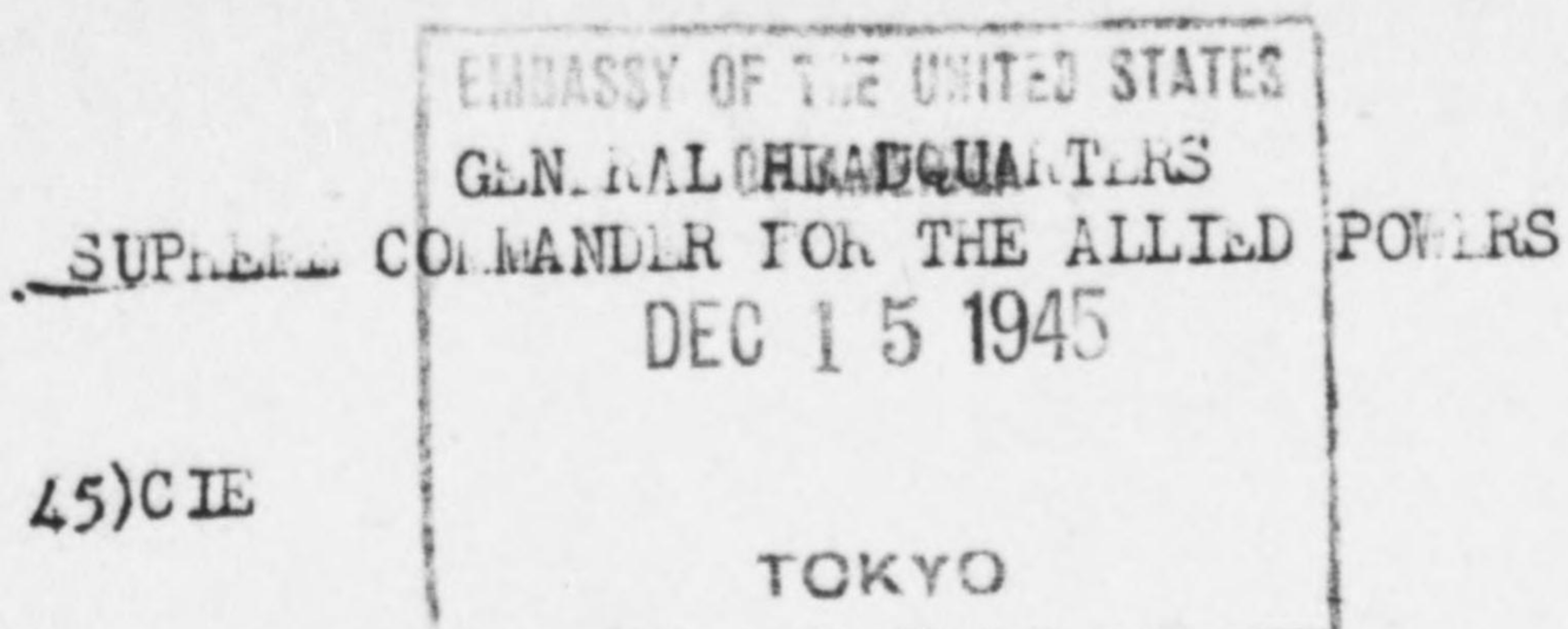

The Imperial Japanese Government, on receipt of this memorandum, will remove from office and employment Takeo Ishiwara now Judge, Kyoto District Court and will not reemploy or reappoint him in any position under the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Justice, any police organ in Japan or to any position dealing in any manner with law enforcement functions.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Abolition of Governmental Sponsorship, Support, Perpetuation, Control, and Dissemination of State Shinto (Kokka Shinto, Jinja Shinto).

1. In order to free the Japanese people from direct or indirect compulsion to believe or profess to believe in a religion or cult officially designated by the state, and

In order to lift from the Japanese people the burden of compulsory financial support of an ideology which has contributed to their war guilt, defeat, suffering, privation, and present deplorable condition, and

In order to prevent a recurrence of the perversion of Shinto theory and beliefs into militaristic and ultra-nationalistic propaganda designed to delude the Japanese people and lead them into wars of aggression, and

In order to assist the Japanese people in a rededication of their national life to building a new Japan based upon ideals of perpetual peace and democracy,

It is hereby directed that:

a. The sponsorship, support, perpetuation, control and dissemination of Shinto by the Japanese national, prefectural, and local governments, or by public officials, subordinates, and employees acting in their official capacity are prohibited and will cease immediately.

b. All financial support from public funds and all official affiliation with Shinto and Shinto shrines are prohibited and will cease immediately.

(1) While no financial support from public funds will be extended to shrines located on public reservations or parks, this prohibition will not be construed to preclude the Japanese Government from continuing to support the areas on which such shrines are located.

(2) Private financial support of all Shinto shrines which

have been previously supported in whole or in part by public funds will be permitted, provided such private support is entirely voluntary and is in no way derived from forced or involuntary contributions.

c. All propagation and dissemination of militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology in Shinto doctrines, practices, rites, ceremonies, or observances, as well as in the doctrines, practices, rites, ceremonies, and observances of any other religion, faith, sect, creed, or philosophy, are prohibited and will cease immediately.

d. The Religious Functions Order relating to the Grand Shrine of Ise and the Religious Functions Order relating to State and other Shrines will be annulled.

e. The Shrine Board (Jingi-in) of the Ministry of Home Affairs will be abolished, and its present functions, duties, and administrative obligations will not be assumed by any other governmental or tax-supported agency.

f. All public educational institutions whose primary function is either the investigation and dissemination of Shinto or the training of a Shinto priesthood will be abolished and their physical properties diverted to other uses. Their present functions, duties, and administrative obligations will not be assumed by any other governmental or tax-supported agency.

g. Private educational institutions for the investigation and dissemination of Shinto and for the training of priesthood for Shinto will be permitted and will operate with the same privileges and be subject to the same controls and restrictions as any other private educational institution having no affiliation with the government; in no case, however, will they receive support from public funds, and in no case will they propagate and disseminate militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology.

h. The dissemination of Shinto doctrines in any form and by any means in any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds is prohibited and will cease immediately.

- (1) All teachers' manuals and textbooks now in use in any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds will be censored, and all Shinto doctrine will be deleted. No teachers' manual or textbook which is published in the future for use in such institutions will contain any Shinto doctrine.
- (2) No visits to Shinto shrines and no rites, practices, or ceremonies associated with Shinto will be conducted or sponsored by any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds.

i. Circulation by the government of "The Fundamental Principles of the National Structure" (Kokutai no Hongi), "The Way of the Subject" (Shinmin no Michi), and all similar official volumes, commentaries, interpretations, or instructions on Shinto is prohibited.

j. The use in official writings of the terms "Greater East Asia War" (Dai Toa Sensō), "The Whole World under One Roof" (Hakkō Ichi-u), and all other terms whose connotation in Japanese is inextricably connected with State Shinto, militarism, and ultra-nationalism is prohibited and will cease immediately.

k. God-shelves (kanidana) and all other physical symbols of State Shinto in any office, school, institution, organization, or structure supported wholly or in part by public funds are prohibited and will be removed immediately.

l. No official, subordinate, employee, student, citizen, or resident of Japan will be discriminated against because of his failure to profess and believe in or participate in any practice, rite, ceremony, or observance of State Shinto or of any other religion.

m. No official of the national, prefectural, or local government, acting in his public capacity, will visit any shrine to report his assumption of office, to report on conditions of government or to participate as a representative of government in any ceremony or observance.

2. a. The purpose of this directive is to separate religion from the state, to prevent misuse of religion for political ends, and to put all religions, faiths, and creeds upon exactly the same legal basis, entitled to precisely the same opportunities and protection. It forbids affiliation with the government and the propagation and dissemination of militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology not only to Shinto but to the followers of all religions, faiths, sects, creeds, or philosophies.

b. The provisions of this directive will apply with equal force to all rites, practices, ceremonies, observances, beliefs, teachings, mythology, legends, philosophy, shrines, and physical symbols associated with Shinto.

c. The term State Shinto within the meaning of this directive will refer to that branch of Shinto (Kokke Shintō or Jinia Shintō) which by official acts of the Japanese Government has been differentiated from the religion of Sect Shinto (Shūha Shintō or Kyōha Shintō) and has been classified a non-religious national cult commonly known as State Shinto, National Shinto, or Shrine Shinto.

d. The term Sect Shinto (Shūha Shintō or Kyōha Shintō) will refer to that branch of Shinto (composed of 13 recognized sects) which by popular belief, legal commentary, and the official acts of the Japanese Government has been recognized to be a religion.

e. Pursuant to the terms of Article I of the Basic Directive on "Removal of Restrictions on Political, Civil, and Religious Liberties" issued on 4 October 1945 by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in which the Japanese people were assured complete religious freedom,

- (1) Sect Shinto will enjoy the same protection as any other religion.
- (2) Shrine Shinto, after having been divorced from the state and divested of its militaristic and ultra-nationalistic elements, will be recognized as a religion if its adherents so desire and will be granted the same protection as any other religion in so far as it may in fact be the philosophy or religion of Japanese individuals.

f. Militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology, as used in this directive, embraces those teachings, beliefs, and theories which advocate or justify a mission on the part of Japan to extend its rule over other nations and peoples by reason of:


- (1) The doctrine that the Emperor of Japan is superior to the heads of other states because of ancestry, descent, or special origin.
- (2) The doctrine that the people of Japan are superior to the people of other lands because of ancestry, descent, or special origin.
- (3) The doctrine that the islands of Japan are superior to other lands because of divine or special origin.
- (4) Any other doctrine which tends to delude the Japanese people into embarking upon wars of aggression or to glorify the use of force as an instrument for the settlement of disputes with other peoples.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit a comprehensive report to this headquarters not later than 15 March 1946 describing in detail all action taken to comply with all provisions of this directive.

4. All officials, subordinates, and employees of the Japanese national, prefectural, and local governments, all teachers and education officials, and all citizens and residents of Japan will be held personally accountable for compliance with the spirit as well as the letter of all provisions of this directive.

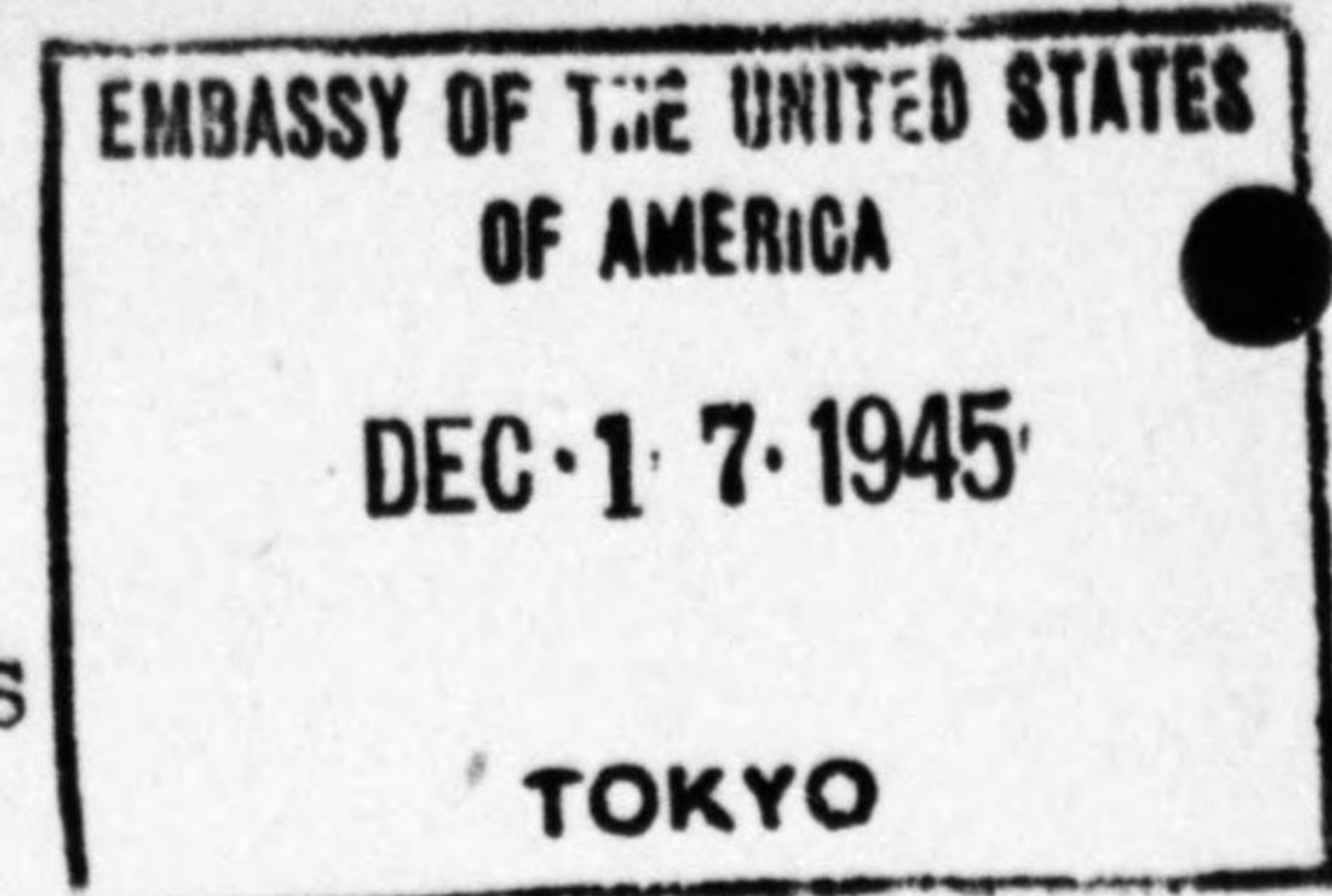

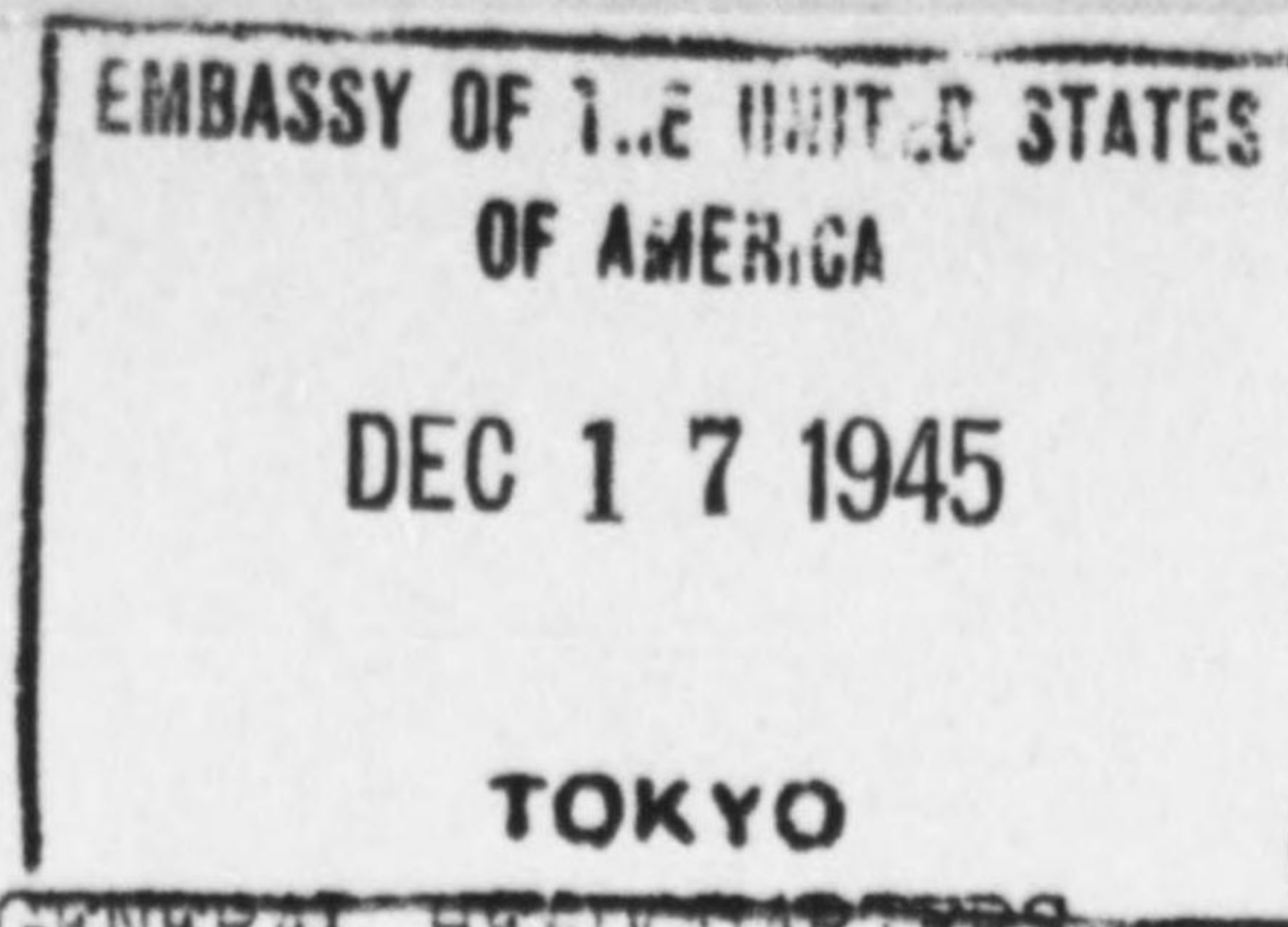

1. Reference is made to memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government from this headquarters dated 13 December 1945, file AG 370.05 (13 Dec 45)GC, subject: "Formosan Repatriation."

2. a. It is reported by Commanding General Eighth United States Army that 7,600 Formosans, encamped in the vicinity of Atsugi Airfield, have been the source of considerable trouble to the local military authorities and constitute a potential threat to the security of the airfield.

b. The Choun Maru is scheduled to depart from Uraga 17 December for Formosa, details are contained in memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 above.

c. Additional shipping to Formosa will be scheduled in the near future.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Give first priority to the evacuation of the 7,600 Formosans now encamped in the vicinity of Atsugi Airfield in their plans for repatriation of Formosans in accordance with shipping schedules as published by SCAJAP.

b. Embark 2,000 of the subject 7,600 Formosans now encamped in vicinity of Atsugi Airfield on the Choun Maru scheduled to depart from Uraga 17 December (same instructions given orally to Mr. Ushiba, C.L.O. on 15 December).

c. Take immediate steps to exercise firmer control over Formosans now encamped in vicinity of Atsugi Airfield until their evacuation is completed.



1. The instructions contained herein supplement those previously published by this headquarters in the following documents:

a. Memorandum this headquarters, file AG 370.05 (13 Dec 45)GC, subject: "Formosan Repatriation."

b. Memorandum this headquarters, file AG 370.05 (15 Dec 45)GC, subject: "Formosans Encamped in Vicinity of Atsugi Airfield."

2. The figures on Formosans in Japan submitted by hand by the Imperial Japanese Government on 8 December 1945 are questionable in that it is believed they include only Formosan forced laborers.

3. It is contemplated establishing repatriation service between Japan and Formosa as follows:

a. Shuttle vessels having a passenger carrying capacity of 3,000 repatriates will operate between the ports of Uruga and Kiirun. These vessels will carry Formosans to Formosa and return Japanese from Formosa to Japan.

b. Shuttle vessels having a passenger carrying capacity of 3,000 repatriates will operate between Kagoshima and Kiirun. Vessels will carry Formosans and Japanese as explained in paragraph 3a above.

c. Augment this traffic by outloading Formosans at Kure aboard Japanese vessels which would otherwise return empty to the Philippines. It is estimated that the Formosan traffic handled by this service will average 600 daily.

d. Sailing directions for vessels engaged in Formosan repatriation will be furnished Imperial Japanese Government in the usual manner by SCAJAP.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government in accordance with provisions of paragraph 3 above will:

a. Prepare plans for evacuation of former residents of Formosa in Japan who are desirous of repatriation.

b. Be prepared to embark capacity loads of Formosans at designated port on each vessel scheduled to carry repatriates from Japan to Formosa.



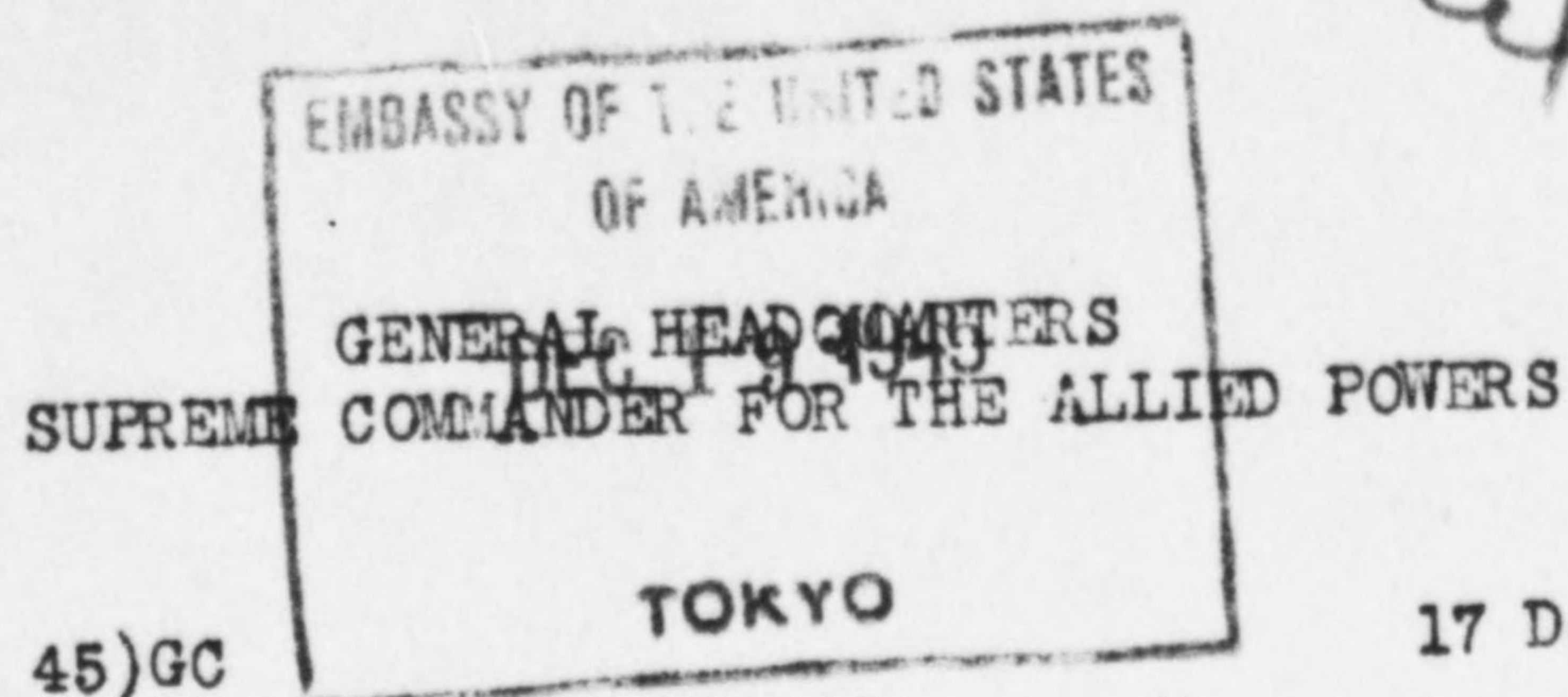

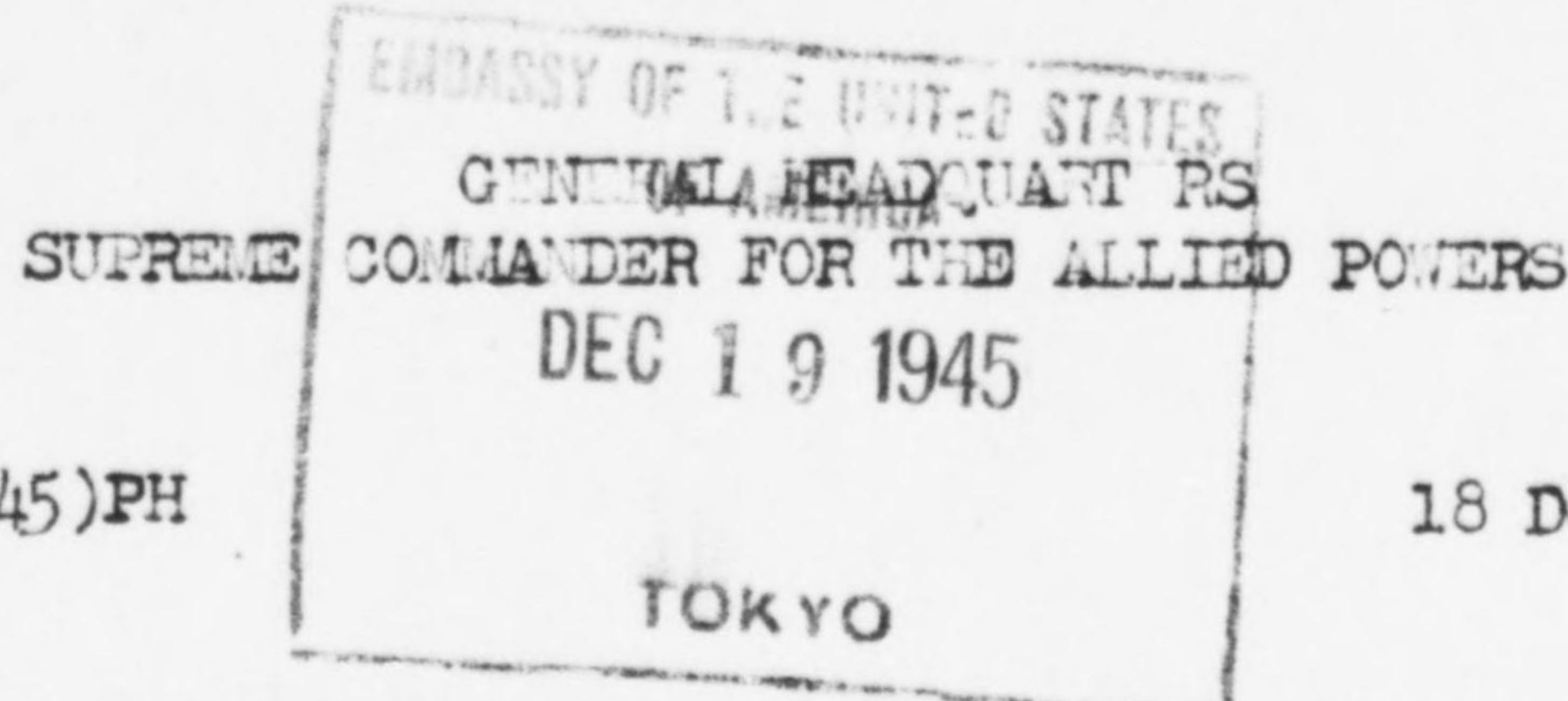

SUBJECT : Control of Traffic in poisonous beverages

1. The illicit sale and trading of untaxed beverages containing methyl alcohol to members of the Allied Occupation Forces has resulted in a number of cases of death, blindness and severe illness among those who have consumed these beverages.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to provide by appropriate enactment that selling or trading in any food or beverage containing methyl alcohol or other poison, and the manufacture, distillation or possession of such food or beverage will be punishable by a fine of not less than 2,000 nor more than 10,000 yen or penal servitude for not less than three nor more than fifteen years, or both such fine and penal servitude.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will rigidly enforce the enactment above directed and all existing Japanese legislation and regulations controlling the trading, manufacture and sale of alcoholic beverages and of methyl alcohol and other poisons.

4. English translations of the enactment issued in accordance with this memorandum will be forwarded in duplicate to this Headquarters immediately upon publication.

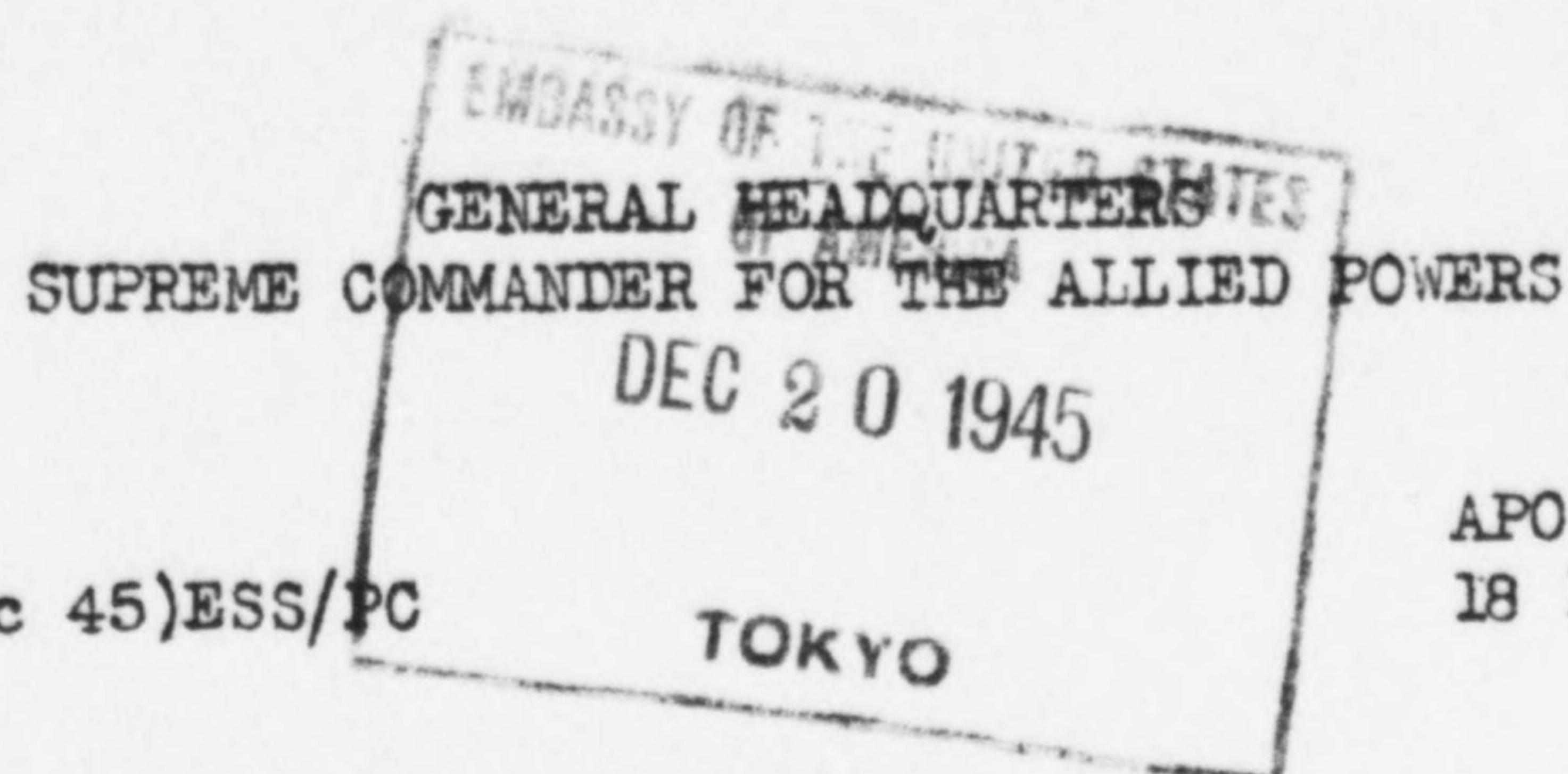

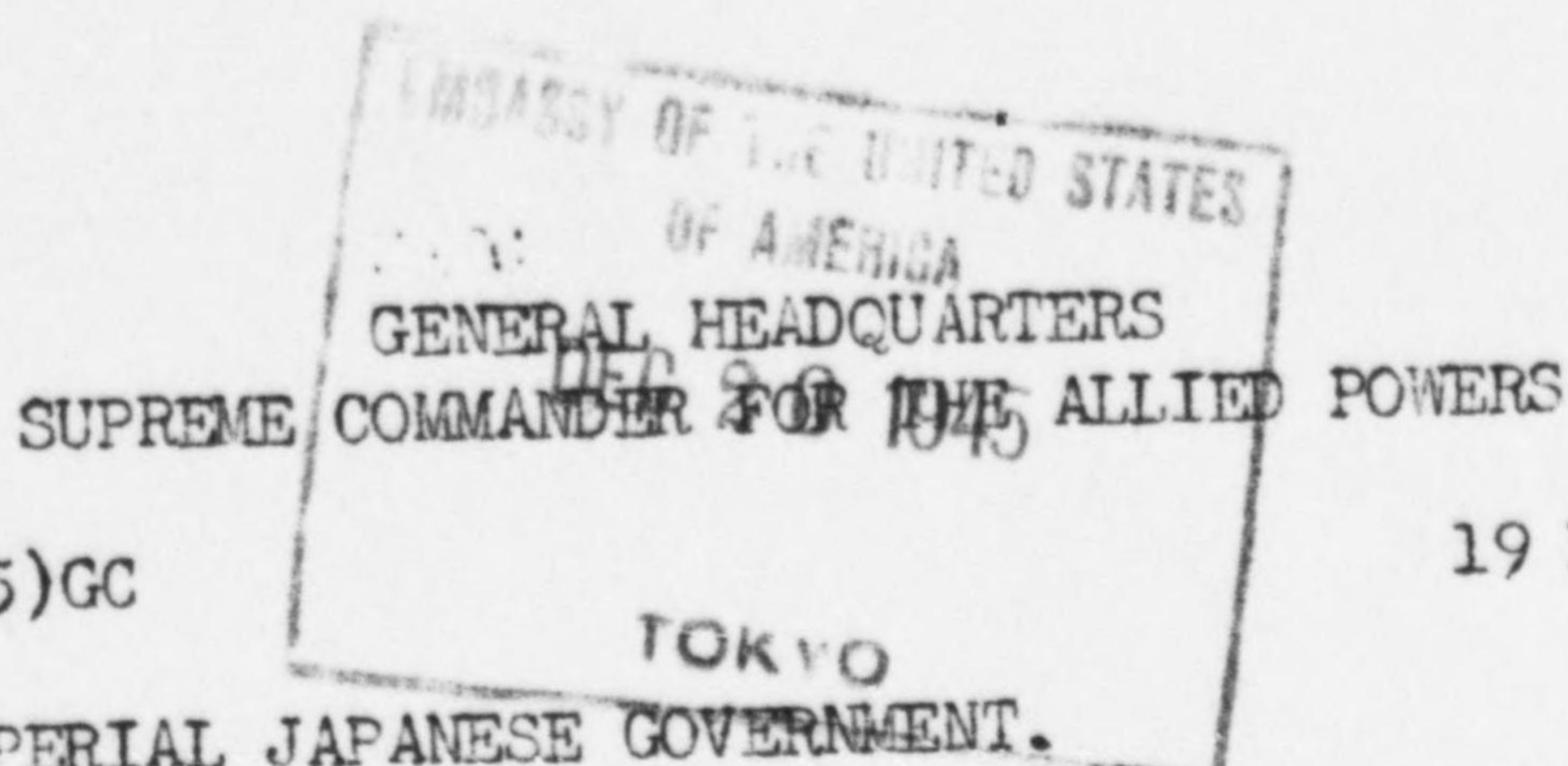

The Imperial Japanese Government shall immediately take such legal or administrative action as may be required to:

a. Restore the right to vote and the right to hold public office to:

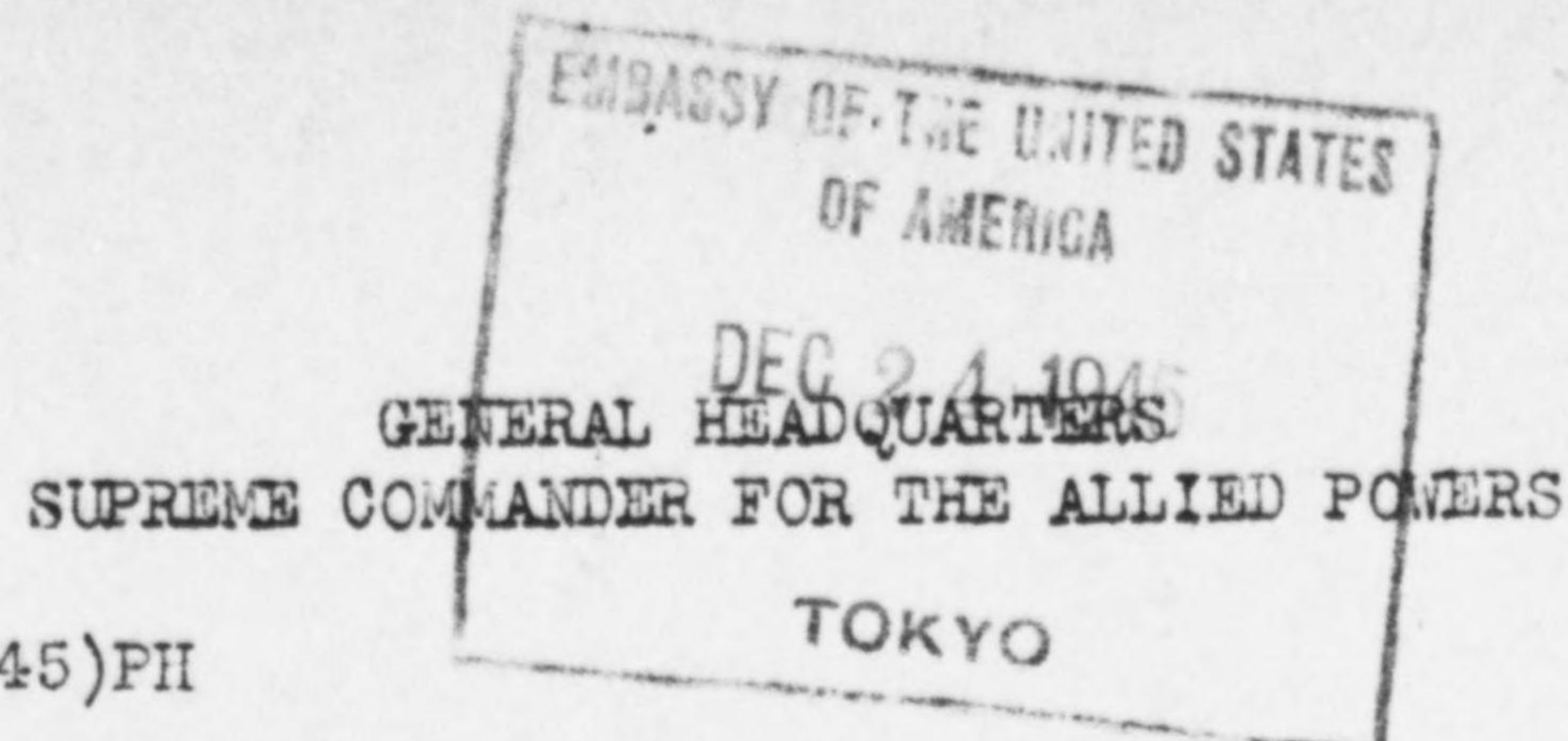
- (1) All persons who were ordered to be released from detention, imprisonment, or protection and surveillance by the terms of the "Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government", subject: "Removal of Restrictions on Political, Civil and Religious Liberties" dated 4 October 1945.
- (2) All persons detained, imprisoned, or under protection and surveillance for violation of the laws, decrees, orders, ordinances, and regulations referred to in the memorandum above described who were released from such restriction prior to 4 October 1945.

NOTE: This restoration of political rights shall be effected by providing and publicising the necessary procedures for late registration and waiver of established residence requirements.

b. Notify not later than 31 December 1945 all persons affected by the terms of this directive that their electoral rights have been restored and specify the procedure which they shall observe to register and/or file candidacy for public office.

SUBJECT : Japanese Military and Naval Medical Supplies Received
by Home Ministry from Occupation Forces.

1. Memorandum, file AG 402.5 (24 Sept 45)GD, subject: "Materials, Supplies and Equipment Received and to be Received from the Japanese Armed Forces", dated 24 September 1945, forwarded by this headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government, directs that the Home Ministry will receive and distribute such supplies and equipment as are to be returned to the Japanese Government.

2. It has been noted from reports received in this headquarters from the Armies and from observation that large quantities of military medical supplies still remain available for distribution through civilian channels. It is known that doctors and hospitals are short of necessary drugs and equipment for proper treatment of the civilian population. This condition must be alleviated by prompt utilization of the existing military stocks.


3. Steps must be taken at once to stimulate the distribution of medical supplies transferred to the Home Ministry and to determine that they reach the consumer. Prompt measures must be taken to assure that:

a. Prefectural officials take vigorous action upon advice that supplies are available at a depot or collection point.

b. The prefectural agencies are furnished sufficient transport, labor and warehouse space, and that a minimum of delay is caused by necessary paper work.

c. Distributing agencies move the supplies to doctors, hospitals and other dispensers expeditiously for the relief of civilian ill.

Proposals recommended in subject letter are hereby approved provided following revisions are accomplished therein:

a. The term "government officials" will be stated to apply to all employees of the government.

b. The proviso that no more than fifty percent of the total sum of wages paid at the respective working places will be exceeded in computing the total increase to be paid workers, will be eliminated.

c. The total of increases authorized as a result of either the temporary basic commodity allowance or increase in basic wage, or both, shall not exceed One Hundred Yen (¥ 100.00) per month.

d. This proposal is approved as a temporary expedient only and will be subject to review and reconsideration by this headquarters at any time.



a. Section (3) states in part, "Relief goods, as a general rule, shall not be used for relief for emergencies or other relief due to special causes. When, however, it shall be deemed specially necessary, permission shall be obtained from the Ministry of Welfare". This statement will be deleted from the plan. Supplies distributed under this arrangement will not be used in mass feeding projects without the approval of the Supreme Commander but no prohibition will be included which prevents the use of supplies in emergencies under procedures set up elsewhere in the plan.

b. Section (4), first paragraph, will be amended to state that exceptions to distribution under the normal ration system will be made only on specific authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. Section (5) will be amended to read:


"The actual distribution of relief goods will be started within each prefecture as soon as preparations under this plan are complete and upon specific authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers."

3. The inventory of reserve supplies submitted in reply to memorandum AG 400 (26 Nov 45)PH is accepted as representing the amount of food and clothing set aside for relief distribution. Any variations in this inventory which may later be discovered will be promptly reported to this headquarters.

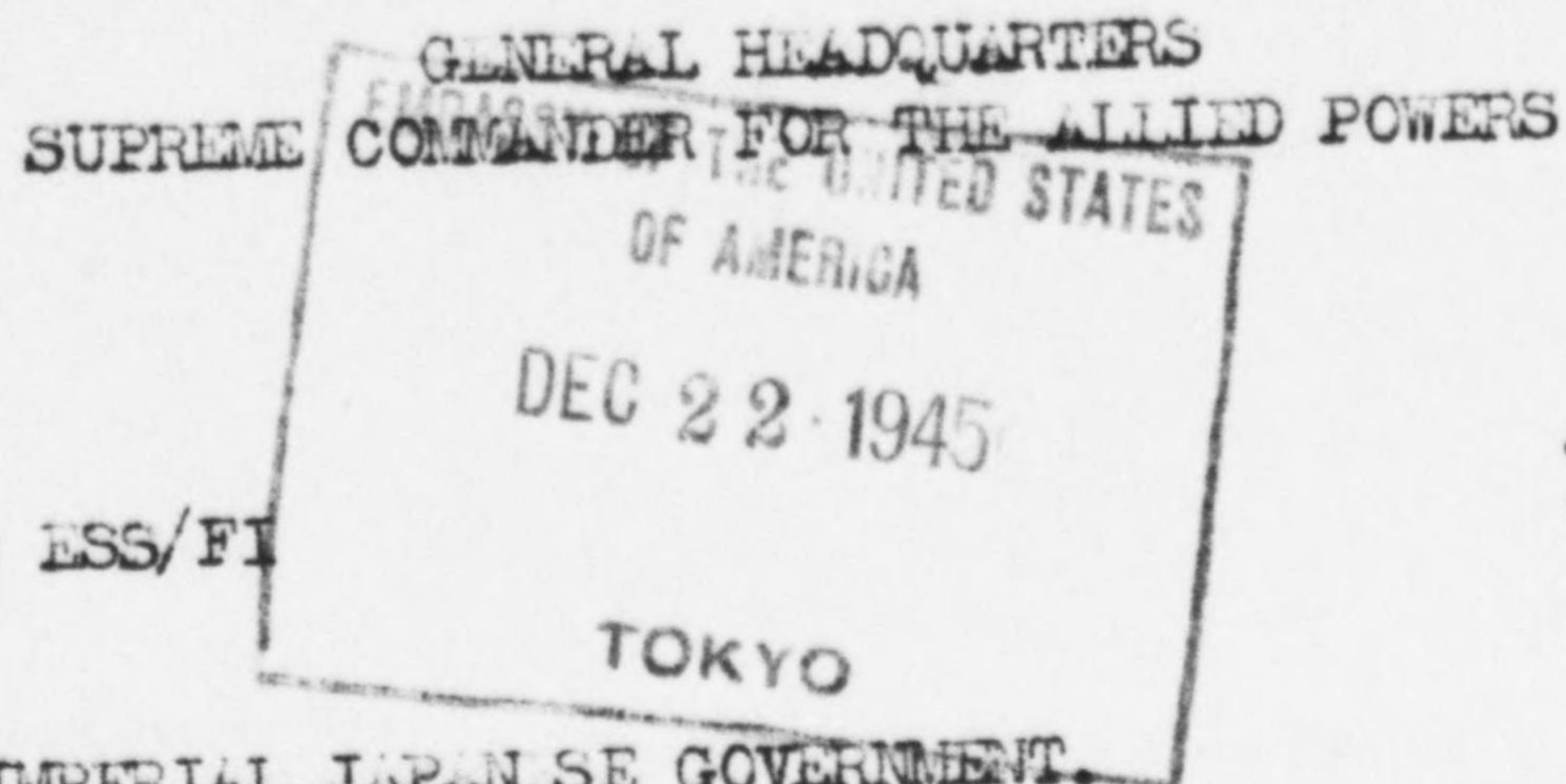

This temporary arrangement is necessary because it is anticipated that Holiday Traffic may be more than the authorized companies can handle.

2. It must be clearly understood that this does not mean an equal distribution between other companies and Press Wireless as Press Wireless is only to handle such messages as other companies are unable to send.



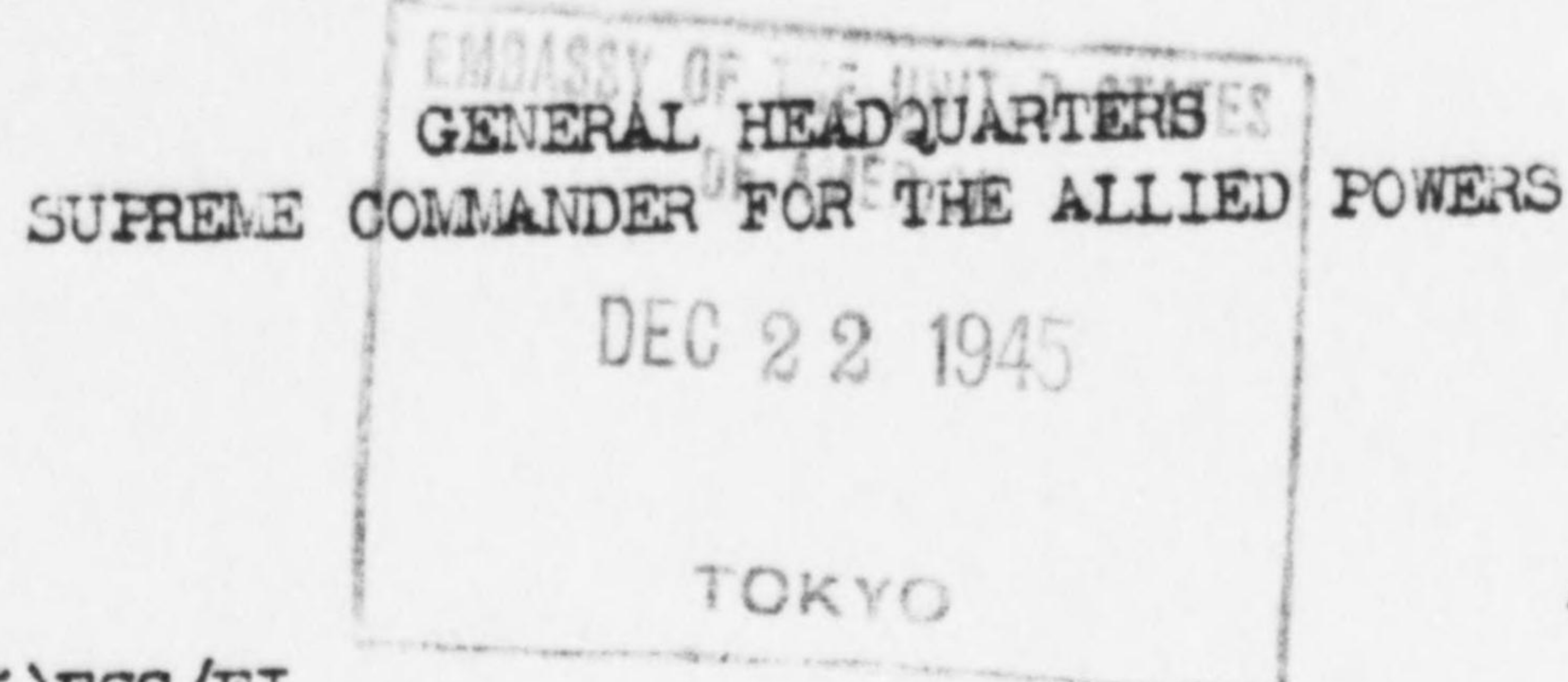

- b. Tables of Organization and Equipment, strength returns, changes in command and military directories.
- c. Health regulations, hospital records and sick reports.
- d. Courts Martial proceedings, records of arrests and confinements, and files of pending cases.

The appointed custodian of the documents will present his credentials and clearance certificate from the port of embarkation to the proper authority at the port of debarkation for final clearance to transfer these documents to the control of Imperial Japanese Government.



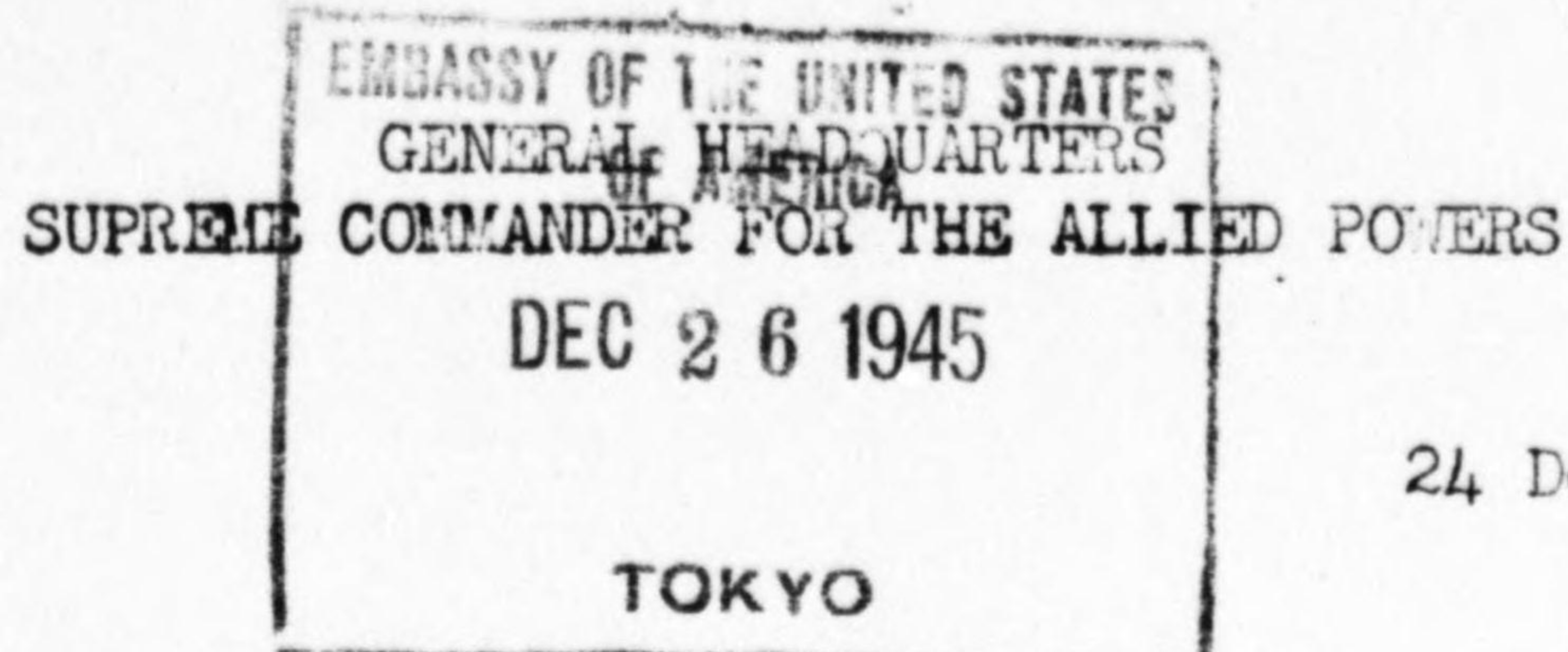

This form will be authenticated by the Commanding Officer of the unit to whom the purchaser is assigned or by an officer designated by the Occupation Force Commanders and will be valid for the exemption of the amount of tax shown thereon.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will accept from vendors properly authenticated certificate in lieu of taxes remitted thereby.

4. It is further desired that on or before 15 January 1946 that all retail vendors in areas in which Occupation Forces are located be required to display prices in English for each article of merchandise except food, showing the price with tax and the amount of tax.



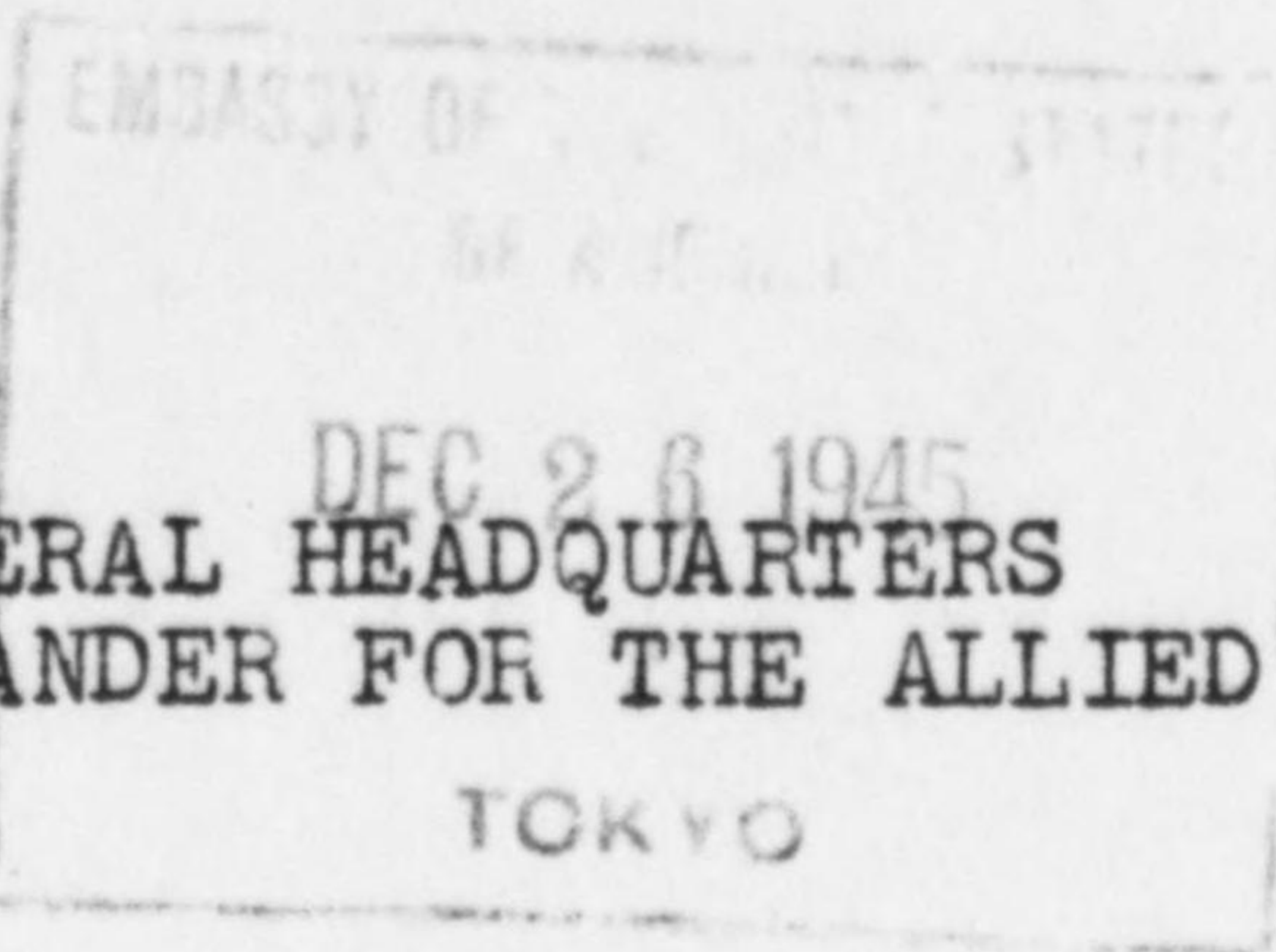

1. In reply to your CLO 401, 29 October 1945 you are advised that deliveries of election materials may be made only to the islets in Oshima-gun of Kagoshima Prefecture north of 30° north latitude excluding Kuchinoshima. No deliveries shall be made in the other islands mentioned in your request.

2. You will notify this Headquarters when such deliveries are proposed to be made seven days in advance of the time such delivery is to be made.

3. You will give appropriate advance public notice of the times when deliveries are to be made. Provisions will be made so that all candidates and political parties interested in the election will have equal opportunity to use the facilities for delivery to and communication with such islands.

4. Neither the granting nor withholding of permission requested in your CLO 401, 29 October 1945 will be interpreted as an indication of Allied policy with regard to the ultimate disposition of such islands.

1. Reference is made to CLO No. 616(2) requesting permission to remove sundry essential items from price and distribution controls.

2. Reference is made to paragraphs 2(a) and (b) of Directive No. 3 (dated 22 September 1945) to the Imperial Japanese Government in which the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to maintain a firm control over prices and a strict rationing program for essential commodities. The request referred to in paragraph 1 above is denied for the following reasons:

a. Abandonment of price controls would stimulate inflationary trends.

b. Abandonment of distribution controls would result in inequities to consumers.

3. In the future, all requests for the abandonment of price controls (as differentiated from price changes) and distribution controls of essential commodities will be accompanied by the following detailed information for each specific item:

a. Total amount of each of the raw materials used in production in the period of a year.

b. Quantity available in stockpiles or at distribution points.

c. Monthly production figures from January 1941 until month before request is made.

d. Estimated current monthly demand.

e. A clear and detailed statement of the distribution controls in existence at the time of the request.

f. Figures showing in detail the actual distribution by months since January 1945.

g. Monthly price changes since January 1937.



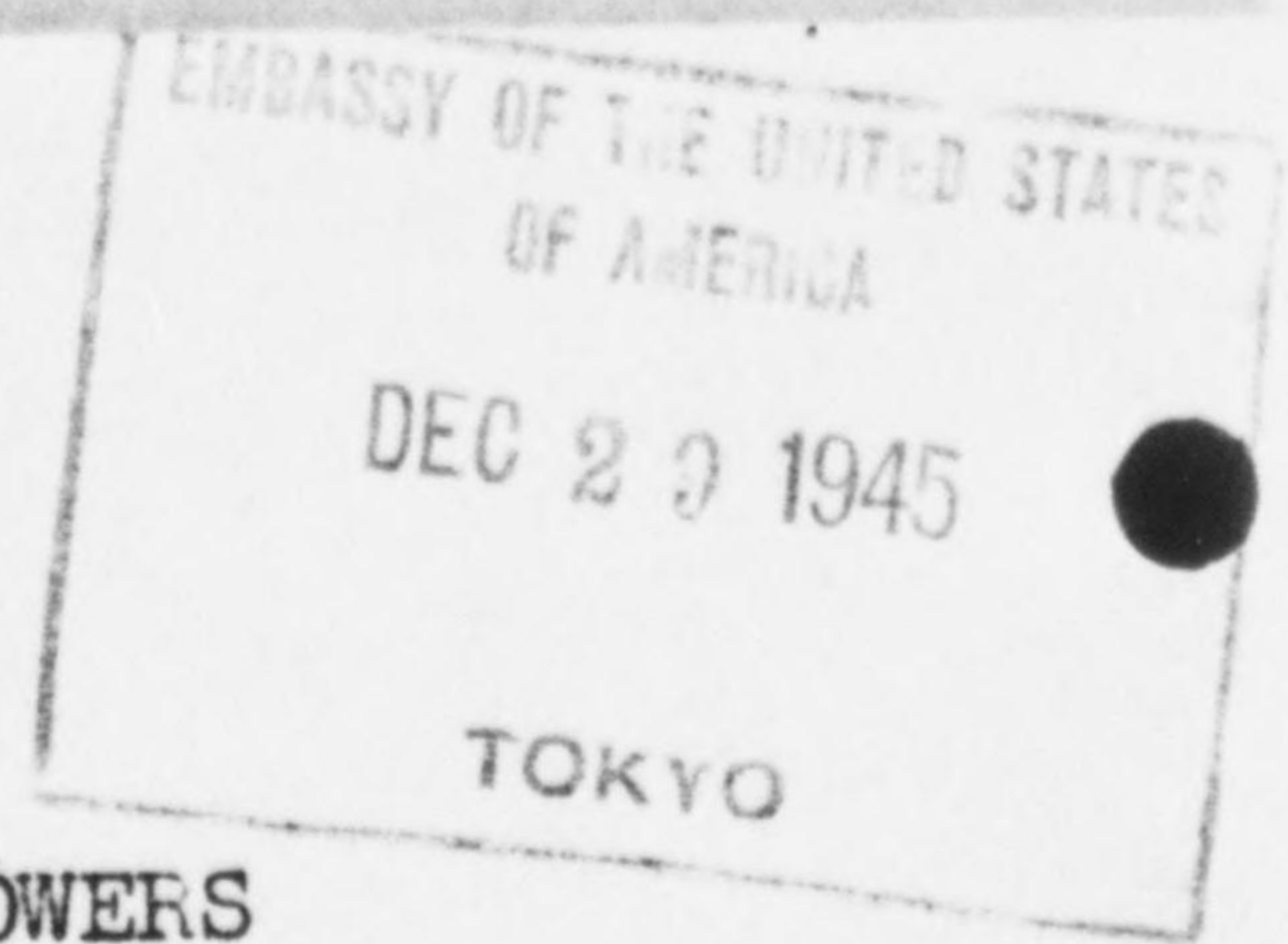

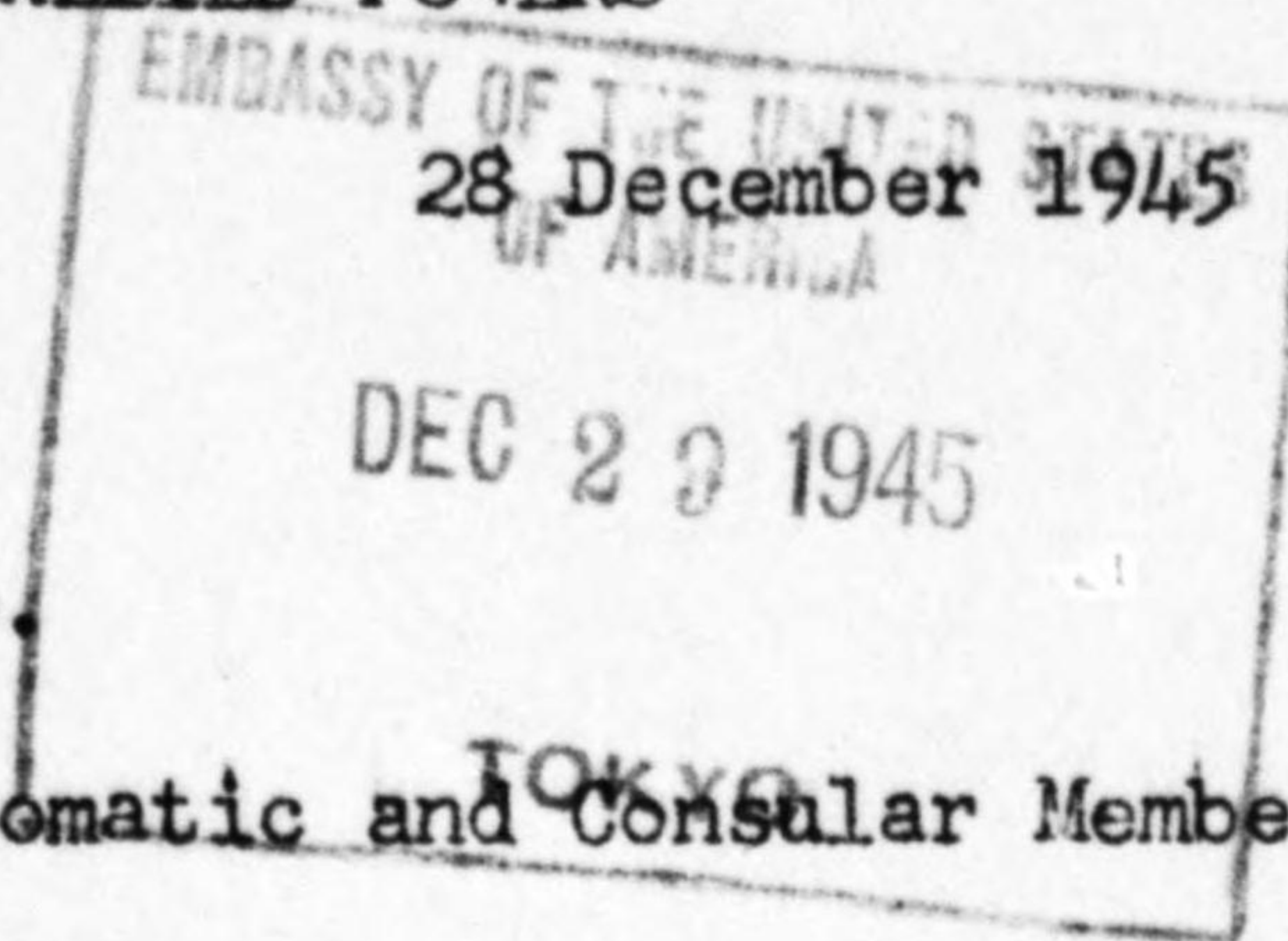
