## GPO Microfilm Program Authorized by Joint Committee on Printing



In a letter dated March 25, 1977, addressed to the Public Printer, Mr. Thomas F. McCormick, from the Chairperson of the Joint Committee on Printing, Senator Howard W. Cannon, authorization was given for the GPO Microform Program. The text is as follows:

"In accordance with and in furtherance of previous authorizations of the Joint Committee on Printing, relative to the response of the Superintendent of Documents to the designated depository libraries pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 19, title 44, United States Code—Depository Library Program, this is to advise that you are authorized as follows:

"(1) To convert to microfiche, as necessary and as requested by individual depository libraries, that category of publications identified as 'non-GPO documentation.'

"(2) To convert to microfiche, as necessary and as requested by individual depository libraries and when savings in costs are clearly demonstrable, that category of publications identified as 'GPO documentation.'

"It is our understanding that GPO's Micropublishing Advisory Council, including appropriate membership from the depository library community and private industry, will be activated.

"It is the Joint Committee's understanding that the continuing initiation of these steps will be vested in the Superintendent of Documents, with your concurrence, rather than being left to the discretion, partially or wholly, of individual departments or agencies.

"Finally, nothing in this authorization shall be construed as establishing any form of a microform sales concept."

## Special GPO Sales Program Scheduled for ALA Meeting

## GPO's Cooperative Cataloging Program

Under the auspices of the Federal Library Committee, the GPO Library Division has begun an ambitious program of shared cataloging with other Federal libraries. A major goal of the program is the reduction of duplicate cataloging efforts, leading to each agency assuming cataloging responsibility for its publications. This will result in tighter bibliographic control, more uniform treatment of documents, and an improvement in the timeliness of the MONTHLY CATALOG.

The program is presently designed for monographs only, since GPO's involvement in CONSER (Conversion of Serials Project) precludes any serials effort. Libraries interested in joining the shared cataloging program should be OCLC members via FEDLINK (Federal Library Network) and cataloging in the MARC format.

The cooperating libraries interact directly with GPO catalogers who are responsible for that agency's publications, and consult on decisions regarding name authorities and series treatment. Following the physical exchange of hard copy, the cooperating agency's cataloging is received at GPO on an OCLC terminal, and is then revised and checked against GPO's authority files for consistency with prior usage in the MONTHLY CATALOG.

Present participants in the program are the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, along with

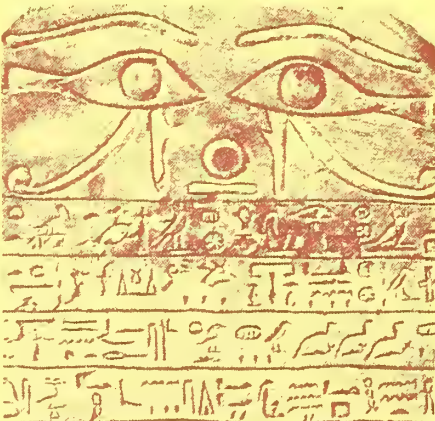

the Department of Transportation. Several other agencies are now at the negotiation/planning stage. Also under consideration is a pilot project with the Library of Congress on Congressional hearings which, it is hoped, will lead to more extensive cooperation in the future. An interesting by-product of these efforts is the eventual establishment of an on-line authority system for U.S. corporate entries.

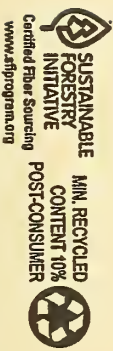
