

INTRODUCTION

The Maryland Newspaper Project

This document is the product of work by many persons from a a variety of institutions over a number of years. The Maryland Newspaper Project is part of the United States Newspaper Program (USNP), a major project of the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), which began in 1982. The objective of the USNP is to locate, catalog and preserve through microfliming all newspapers ever published in this country. Maryland's part in this massive undertaking began in 1983, when the Maryland State Archives obtained partial funding from NEH to do a preliminary survey of newspaper holdings in the state. Using the information gained in this planning phase of the Maryland Newspaper Project, the University of Maryland at College Park Libraries applied for and was granted partial funding by NEH to undertake the task of locating and cataloging all newspapers held in Maryland. This bibliographic phase of the Maryland Newspaper Project began in 1988 and was completed by the end of 1990. Residual funds from the bibliographic phase, which completed its work ahead of schedule, were granted by NEH to the Maryland State Archives, where they are currently being used to microfilm newspapers, beginning the preservation phase of the Maryland Newspaper Project.

What this Guide Contains

This guide includes entries for all of the newspapers recorded during the bibliographic phase of the Maryland Newspaper Project. Project staff visited scores of libraries, archives, historical societies and newspaper offices throughout the State of Maryland. In the end, 87 repositories were found that permanently hold one or more issues of a newspaper. Only repositories open to the public are included, and only newspapers held permanently are recorded. The repositories are listed, with their addresses, telephone numbers, and identifying codes, on pp. v-xv.

Bibliographic information about each title found was entered into the national library database of the On-line Computer Library Center, Inc. (OCLC). All of the holdings of each title found at any of these 87 repositories in Maryland were then added to the appropriate entry. Holdings entries indicate whether the title is held in paper or microfilm format. For an example of how each entry is organized, see "sample entry" and "key to

sample entry," pp. xvi-xvii. Note that because the criteria for inclusion in this guide is United States newspaper titles <u>held</u> in Maryland, many titles <u>published</u> outside the state are included.

There are approximately 2,356 titles in this list. About 5,308 holdings of these titles are shown. The list of these newspapers is arranged alphabetically by place of publication, so that newspapers published in Alabama are listed first. Within each state, the titles are then arranged alphabetically by city or town of publication. And within each city or town of publication, the titles are arranged alphabetically by title. Filing rules for the arrangement by title are given on p. xviii.

One anomaly that may puzzle users of this guide is that listings for newspapers published in Takoma Park are given twice. The reason for this is that the complete entry in the OCLC database includes a field for "county of publication." As all Takoma Parkers know, their town is partly in Montgomery County and partly in Prince George's County. Hence, each title and holdings had to be entered twice. Eventually OCLC Inc. hopes to be able to provide an index to holdings by county; presently this is not available.

What this Guide Is Not

This guide is not a permanent, final source for information about the newspapers of Maryland. Rather, it records titles and holdings as of October 1, 1990. Repositories constantly add titles, new newspapers appear and old ones merge or die, and, most importantly, newspapers continue to be preserved by microfilming. At least three institutions are currently microfilming Maryland newspapers in significant numbers. These are Octo Archives, Inc. in Laurel, Maryland, University importantly, the Maryland State Archives in Annapolis. And, as in all human enterprises, there may be errors in this guide.

We would very much like to keep the database from which this guide was produced as accurate as possible, so that that further "editions" of this guide may be produced as needed. Users of this guide are requested to alert us to errors and other needed changes by writing to Maryland Newspaper Project, Bibliographic College Park Libraries, College Park, MD 20742.

This guide is not copyright. Users are free to reproduce part or all of it as they wish. The goal of this entire Project has been, and continues to be, to improve as much as possible the Maryland's history--her newspapers.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Many persons and institutions have played vital roles in the production of this guide. The National Endowment for the Humanities provided partial--but essential--funding for the entire Maryland Newspaper Project. Dr. Jeffrey Field of NEH provided support and encouragement at all times, helping keep the work on course. For more than one year and a half we operated this Project out of space they cleared for us in their stacks. They allowed us free run of their extensive newspaper stacks, and they gave us unlimited use of their telephones. And we would also be remiss not to thank the Maryland State Archives, which microfilmed for us, partially at their expense, 487,105 pages of newspapers which were so deteriorated that they could not be cataloged until they had been microfilmed.

This valuable service gives access to all of this information about Maryland newspapers to the many individuals and institutions who do not have access to the OCLC database.

is often the bane of a temporary, grant-funded project. The Maryland Newspaper Project has been blessed by a truly outstanding and dedicated staff. Melanie Gardner, Asssistant Director and Cataloger, got the work off to an excellent start during the first year. After she left for a permanent position as head of the Special Collections Department at Bowie State University's library, Project Assistant Christine Sandy carried on efficiently and effectively by herself for more than six months. The turning point for the Project came with the hiring of Beverley Geer-Butler as Assistant Director and Cataloger in August 1989. An experienced serials cataloger, Ms. Geer-Butler tirelessly and effectively planned and oversaw the day-to-day operations of the Project down to its successful conclusion. It also shows that the Maryland State Archives has this title available on microfilm for the period 9/19/1946 through 6/17/1947.
