

Pune (, pronounced), formerly called **Poona**, also known as **Punya-Nagari**, is the [eighth largest metropolis] in [India], the second largest in the state of [Maharashtra] after [Mumbai], and the largest city in the [Western Ghats]. Once the center of power of the [Maratha Empire], it is situated 560 metres above sea level on the [Deccan plateau] at the confluence of the [Mula] () and [Mutha river] s (), Pune is the administrative capital of [Pune district].

Pune is known to have existed as a town since 937 AD. Chhatrapati [Shivaji] Maharaj, the founder of the [Maratha Empire], lived in Pune as a young boy, and later oversaw significant growth and development of the town during his reign. In 1730, Pune became an important political center as the seat of the [Peshwa], the prime minister of the [Chhatrapati] of Satara. After the town was annexed to [British India] in 1817, it served as a [cantonment] town and as the "monsoon capital" of the [Bombay Presidency] until the [independence of India].







Albertosaurus is a genus of tyrannosaurid theropod dinosaur that lived in western North America during the Late Cretaceous Period, more than 70 million years ago. The type species, *A. sarcophagus*, was restricted in range to the modern-day Canadian province of Alberta, after which the genus is named. Scientists

disagree on the content of the genus, with some recognizing *Gorgosaurus libratus* as a second species. As a tyrannosaurid, *Albertosaurus* was a bipedal predator with tiny, two-fingered hands and a massive head with dozens of large, sharp teeth. It may have been at the top of the food chain in its local ecosystem. Although relatively large for a theropod, *Albertosaurus* was much smaller than its more famous relative *Tyrannosaurus*, probably weighing less than 2 metric tons. Since the first discovery in 1884, fossils of more than thirty individuals have been recovered, providing scientists with a more detailed knowledge of *Albertosaurus* anatomy than is available for most other tyrannosaurids. The discovery of 22 individuals at one site provides evidence of pack behaviour and allows studies of ontogeny and population biology which are impossible with lesser-known dinosaurs. (more...)



George V (1865-1936) was King of the United Kingdom and the British Dominions, and Emperor of India, from 6 May 1910 through World War I until his death in 1936. He was the first British monarch of the House of Windsor, which he created from the British branch of the German House of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha. From the age of twelve George served in the Royal Navy, but upon the unexpected death of his elder brother, Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, he became heir to the throne and married his brother's fiancée, Mary of Teck. Although they occasionally toured the British Empire,

George preferred to stay at home with his stamp collection and lived what later biographers would consider a dull life because of its conventionality. George became King-Emperor in 1910 on the death of his father, King Edward VII. During World War I he relinguished all German titles and styles on behalf of his relatives who were British subjects, and changed the name of the royal house from Saxe-Coburg and Gotha to Windsor. During his reign, the Statute of Westminster separated the crown so that George ruled the dominions as separate kingdoms, preparing the way for the future development of the Commonwealth of Nations. His reign also witnessed the rise of socialism, communism, fascism, Irish republicanism, and the first Labour ministry. (more...)
