16 And Pahalaleel lined after he begate Jared, eight hundred and thirtie peeres, and begate sonnes & daughters.

17 And all the dayes of Mahalaleel, were eight hundred ninette and fine yeeres, and he died.

18 CAnd Jared liued an hundzed lixtic and two yeeres, The begat Enoch.

19 And Jared lined after he begate Enoch, eight hundred peres, and begate sonnes and daughters.

20 And all the dayes of Jared were nine hundred sixtie and two peeres, and he died.

21 And Enoch lived sixtie and five peeres, and begate | Methuselah.

22 And Enoch walked with God, after he begate Methuselah, three hundied peeres, and begate sonnes and daughters.

23 And all the dayes of Enoch, were three hundred lixtie and fine peeres.

24 And*Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God tooke him.

25 And Wethuselah liued an hundied eightie and seuen peeres, and begat Lamech.
