Subject: Memorial Day Event, May 27, 2019, schedule and new features

Good Morning, Gentlemen:

This is Henry M. Stoever, with PeaceWorks, Kansas City, (913) 375-0045 (cell phone) with information in regard to our upcoming annual Memorial Day events, which will be held on Monday, May 27, 2019.

In regard to this event, it is the ninth (9th) year we have held such an event.

Information compiled is that 154 persons who worked at Honeywell Nuclear Weapons Part Plant died as a result of working there, and over 250 persons came forward that they became seriously ill as a result of working at the Plant. Each Memorial Day, we remember these and other victims of war. 85% of the non-nuclear parts of a nuclear weapon are manufactured and/or assembled at this Plant -- the guidance system, the triggering device, the interior and exterior parts of a nuclear weapon. We make the weapon itself, and the nuclear bullet is made and installed elsewhere. The budget for the new NNSA plant is \$716 million in 2018, \$761 in 2019, and \$1billion is being requested for 2020, by the DOE. Precious resources are needed for so many human needs. We seek to end this Madness.

What makes this Memorial Day event special: 1st, Lu (Linda) Mountenay, board member, line-crosser on four (4) occasions died of cancer on Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019, and her church memorial will be held this Saturday, May 11, 2019, at 2:00 PM, at Walnut Gardens Community of Christ Church, Independence, MO, where Lu was the Minister. Lu had signed up to cross the line again this year. Instead, a small amount of Lu's ashes and her photo will cross the line, carried by a family member or friend.

2nd, this year, we will have three (3) European women join us, one is a videographer from Berlin, who is working on a documentary on Catholic workers, and the other two women work in a Catholic Worker House in Dortmund to give relief to those in need. Last year, our Ann Suellentrop, was at the Air Force base in Germany where 20 American nuclear weapons are stationed. Many Germans want these nuclear weapons removed from their soil. We wonder if these nuclear weapons were constructed here at the Kansas City Nuclear Weapons Campus. Last year, Ann and others were arrested at this German base. I asked Ann what happened, and Ann said: We were treated very courteously and respectfully, we spoke to the personnel about why we were here, we were detained for three (3) hours and we were asked questions, no tickets or citations were issued, there was no fine or court procedure, the Germans were issued a one-day ban letter, and they were released at the gate of the Air Base. To my knowledge, the three European women will be leaving our country shortly after this event.

Schedule for May 27, 2019:

10:00 AM, Witness at Bannister Federal Complex, 1500 Bannister Road, KCMO, assemble at former Wayne St. entry, short rally concerning toxins and affects suffered by Plant workers.

11:00 AM, Gather at Prospect and Missouri Highway 150, park alongside Prospect, for a one-mile walk to the main entrance to the National Security Campus.

11:30 AM, Rally at the entry road, on public right-of-way, at the new plant, 14510 Botts Road, with talks, remembrance of Lu Mountenay, music, etc.

Noon, Stage a Die-in on the public right-of-way, commemorating the more than 154 persons who died from Bannister Plant contaminants, and those who may die in a future nuclear exchange.

12:15 PM, Crossing the property line by those risking arrest.

All actions will be respectful and totally non-violent.

Number of persons who will risk arrest: Last year, there were five (5) persons who crossed the line. Lu was one of the line crossers. Tom Fox of National Catholic Reporter, president & CEO will be in California to give a commencement address. I have heard that one or more of Lu's family may cross the line. I will cross the line. I hope to be able to give you some numbers closer to the event.

Feel free to contact me at any time.

Captain Ryan Mills and I spoke earlier today, and his Swat team may be onsite, due to the shortage of other officers available.

Bill, I know that you usually come on duty now in the afternoon, so you will pass this information on to the lead security person in the morning.
