Symbols

- 1+ characters chosen from the set of
 - all letters (both upper and lower case)
 - digits
- ',\$' On most machines, you can also use \$

in symbol names; exceptions are noted in Chapter 9 [Machine Dependencies], page 79.

- may not begin with a digit
- case is significant
- no length limit
- delimited
 - by characters not in that set
 - by the beginning of a file

Statements

- A statement ends at a newline character ('') or line separator character(;).
- A statement begins with zero or more labels
- A statement optionally followed by a key symbol which determines what kind of statement it is.
 - the symbol begins with a dot '.' : an assembler directive
 - the symbol begins with a letter: an assembly language instruction:
- A label is a symbol immediately followed by a colon (:)

Number Constants

- Integers : int in the C language
 - binary: '0b' or '0B'
 - octal: '0'
 - decimal: starts with a non-zero digit
 - hexdecimal: '0x' or '0X'
- Bignums : int more than 32 bits
 - the same syntax and semantics as int
- Flonums : floating point numbers
 - The digit '0'
 - A letter e
 - ('+-')(int part) (frac part)(exp part)

Configuring listing output: '-listing'

This feature combines the input source file(s) with a hex dump of the corresponding locations in the output object file The format of this listing can be controlled by directives inside the assembler source

- list
- title
- .sbttl
- psize
- eject

Join Text and Data Sections: '-R'

- treat all data-section data in the text section.
- the data section part of your object file is zero bytes long
- generate shorter address displacements
